

The charge upon which the summary suspension is based is set forth below.

Charge I:


Your license to practice medicine was summarily suspended in another jurisdiction, for which your license to practice medicine may be summarily suspended in the District of Columbia pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 3-1205.15(a)(1)(A) (2001).

On May 29, 2013, the Maryland Board of Physicians (the "Board") summarily suspended your license to practice medicine based on an investigation conducted by the Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, Office of Health Care Quality ("OHCQ"). The Board concluded that your actions constituted an imminent threat to the public health, which imperatively required the immediate suspension of your license to practice medicine. On June 12, 2013, a hearing was held on the summary suspension, and on that same date, the Board determined that it would not lift the summary suspension. To date, your license to practice medicine in Maryland has not been reinstated.

A request for a hearing will not stay this summary suspension.
