A MESSAGE FROM JULIE

This year has been another whirlwind. Trust Women has come so far, all the way from its inception at my kitchen table. We faced a harrowing legislative season in both Kansas and Oklahoma. We are preparing to open up our second clinic, reintroducing access to abortion care in Oklahoma City, despite roadblocks and challenges. We held our inaugural Major Donor Conference this summer. All of this has only been possible with your commitment and support.

This year, our staff and volunteers have made considerable strides in strengthening reproductive rights and abortion care access. We reached 28,940 people through door -to-door outreach, 2,123 peoplethrough community events and tens of thousands of others through traditional and social media outreach.

Abortion bans on Dilation and Evacuation (D&E), which limit abortion care in the 2 nd trimester of pregnancy, have passed in both Kansas and Oklahoma. This dangerous ban is working its way through the courts. We are not waiting for an answer; inste ad, we are bringing this issue to our constituents. Using face-to-face outreach, traditional press, social media campaigns and targeted outreach to make sure people know precisely how dangerous this law is.

In the pages ahead, you'll read more about this dangerous law and how it

disproportionately affects impoverished communities, communities of color and young pregnant people. You'll also read more about the innovative solutions we are using in what many call "unwinnable" states because this is where women need us the most.

Looking back on this past year in events, notes, articles and meetings, the one thing I hear more than anything else is how shocked and outraged people are over the devious tactics and extreme laws perpetuated by antichoice activists. They are willing to endanger people's lives in order to control a woman's fertility and body.

To our contributors and supporters: thank you for what you have made possible this year. I want you to know that there are thousands of women who you have helped, directly and indirectly, through this work. This is challenging work and I'm glad that you are with us on this journey.

To those who may not be familiar with our organization: please use this report as a chance to learn more about us. We are dedicated to working in places that are in desperate need of abortion access. We will not ignore underserved communities in politically hostile s tates. Thank you for all that you do.




MAKING AN IMPACT

Trust Women's flagship clinic in Wichita, Kansas has been operating for over 2 years. We offer abortions, contraceptives, sexually

transmitted infection (STI) testing and treatment, early obstetrics, other gynecological care, transgender careand LGBTQIA friendly health care.



Trust Women clinics are designed to be CARE welcoming and safe. We ensure high quality health care, specializing in GYN CARE abortion. Our staff 13% and physicians create a nonjudgmental safe space for all our CONTROL patients. And as 12% always, we are committed to providing full reproductive health care in the most challenging communities.



We are now preparing to renovate our second clinic, in Oklahoma City. Headway has been slow thanks to anti-choice regulations and uncooperative bureaucrats. But regardless of the challenges and roadblocks, Trust Women is committed to expanding abortion access in underserved communities to make sure all women can have access to health care, including abortion, regardless of where they live or their ability to pay.



STANDARD OF CARE



Laura came to us directly from her local hospital where she was being treated for hyperemesis, a rare pregnancy complication causing persistent vomiting and nausea. The resulting risks are malnutrition, anemia, pulmonary embolism and many other life - threatening complications. She had been in the hospital for four weeks already, before she and her family decided that ending this pregnancy was the safest option for them.

We were able to see her for a surgical abortion and check her into a Wichita area hospital later that day to further monitor her. She went back home the next day to her family and was able to spend the holidays at home and not in a hospital.

Her small town hospital refused to provide a simple 1st trimester abortion, leaving her with two options:

1. Drive two hours away to be seen in Wichita for a ten minute procedure.

OR


2. Spend an additional 30 weeks in the hospital risking her life to carry the pregnancy to term.

She chose to have an abortion. There are others who may have chosen the latter option. Regardless, though, the only appropriate decision maker is the pregnant woman herself.

Since South Wind Women's Center Wichita opened, almost 5,000 patients have been seen Additionally, we've given financial assistance to approximately one-third of our clients. More and more people are seeking health care at South Wind for gynecological, transgender and other reproductive health care.

We are reaching thousands of people across the country through traditional news media. Trust Women's work is being featured more and more in top news outlets that are read by decision-makers and political leaders.





THE PHYSICIAN INTIMIDATION & CRIMINALIZATION ACT

On May 14, 2015 the Kansas state legislature passed a brand new abortion ban—a ban on the Dilation and Evacuation or D&E procedure. This law was the first of its kind in the country to pass. Two weeks later, the Oklahoma state legislature followed in Kansas' footsteps.

Additional attempts to pass this legislation, written by national anti -choice organizations, were made in South Dakota, Michigan, Missouri and South Carolina. It is also going to be introduced in Nebraska in 2016.

This dangerous abortion ban, and the tactics used by anti-choice organizations, was modeled after a nationwide abortion ban passed in 2007. The Bush administration signed a ban on Dilation and Extraction or D&X p rocedures, justifying that there were

other methods available and that D&X was particularly reprehensible as a procedure. D&E is the safest and most common abortion procedure for pregnant people in the second trimester. This law effects roughly 1 in 10 abortion patients. It is also the internationally accepted standard of care for second trimester abortions. The law has been temporarily enjoined in Kansas and Oklahoma.

Anti -choice organizations have crafted the emotionally charged language of this bill very carefully and plan on spreading this abortion ban in 2016. That is why Trust Women is fighting this law on the ground with a face-to-face outreach program, as well as a robust national communications plan. Restrictions are not just defeated in the courts, they are fought and won in the court of public opinion as well .

"It would definitely impact women coming in for second-trimester procedures, but it's also something that could impact women who are coming in in the first trimester. There's not a clear line. This would impact our overall ability to provide abortion care."

ADVOCACY

Trust Women not only opens clinics, but also advocates on behalf of our clinics, physicians and patients. Our advocacy program is an essential component of what we do.

We aim to engage communities and individuals in a dialogue about abortion and reproductive rights. Trust Women is using sophisticated online tools and technology as well as grassroots organizing—tabling events, speaking engagements, house parties, phone banking and door-to-door canvassing. We are engaging and mobilizing supporters in a movement to defend a woman's right to make decisions about her health care.

Here are just a few highlights from events we participated in and organized in 2014 and 2015:

- □ Organized in coalition with I CTacts and other organizations the Stop Violence Against Women March with 200 attendees.
- Filmed 4 short documentaries with the 1in3 Campaign for the first national abortion speak out day; featuring the personal stories of TW's volunteers & staff.

- ☑ Hosted our first sex education panel with local sexual health experts in the Wichita community.
- □ Julie testified against Senate Bill 95 the
 □ D&E abortion ban, in both the Senateand
 House Committees.
- ☑ Julie presented at a symposium at Wichita State University titled "Peace in the Home" about ending domestic and intimate partner violence.
- Presented on several panelsand cosponsored the Take Root: Red States Perspectives on Reproductive Justice Conference.
- Julie spoke at several churches in Kansas about the worth of a woman and her work with Dr. George R. Tiller.
- □ Completed our second door-to-door canvass in conjunction with the Women's Equality Campaign.
- ☑ Hosted events in New York, California, Colorado, Oklahoma, Mis souri, Washington D.C. and Florida
- Held a luncheon for religious leaders who support reproductive health care and access.


AT A GLANCE

This past year has been financially successful Not only did our core donors continue with generous support, but we received more grants, more new contributors and have expanded our online giving programs dramatically.


Moreover, the number of people who give on a regular monthly basis has quadrupled. Thi s keeps our costs low and means we can plan ahead.
