Dear Ms. Dejene and Ms. Strachan,

At the scheduling conference held on September 26, 2001, you were directed to report to me by not later than October 3, 2001, regarding proposed trial dates. I have heard from Ms. Strachan but not from Ms. Dejene. Accordingly, I have scheduled this case for a bench trial as follows: Plaintiff's evidence will be heard at 10:30 a.m. on November 13, 2001. Defendant's evidence will be heard at 10:00 a.m. on December 11, 2001, and on December 12, 2001 at 2:00 p.m. if not completed on December 11. All proceedings will take place in Courtroom 3A. Please report to the courtroom by not later than 10:00 a.m. on November 13, and give the Clerk a copy of each of your exhibits at that time.


By not later than October 31, 2001, each of you must serve on the other, with a copy to me, your witness list and exhibits list. No witnesses who were not identified during discovery may be listed, and no witnesses who are not listed will be permitted to testify.

Ms. Strachan's motion to dismiss this case for lack of subject matter jurisdiction was filed on October 1, 2001, and Ms. Dejene's response is due on October 19, 2001. Ms. Dejene will receive a letter from the Clerk addressing the possible consequences of this motion, which include dismissal of the case, and she is hereby reminded to read this letter carefully and heed its warnings.

On October 4, 2001, I received a facsimile from Ms. Dejene, a copy of which is enclosed with Ms. Strachen's copy of this letter. Ms. Dejene was provided with a copy of the court's letterhead for the sole purpose of giving her the court's address and is requested not to use it for any other purpose. In addition, all papers sent to the court must also be served on the other party.

Despite the informal nature of this letter, it is an order of the court and the clerk is directed to docket it as such.
