### Friends,

We are pleased to share our review of EGC action and advocacy for 2011.

Another round of anti-choice and anti-women legislation, coupled with challenging economic times for small, independent businesses and the women we serve have only strengthened our resolve to hold fast to our mission. We exist to empower women and men in all life stages through the provision of quality reproductive health care. This past year has seen a surge of attacks against the rights of women. There really is a WAR AGAINST WOMEN being waged by the far right. It seems as though everywhere we turn, legislation is being introduced that limit women's sovereignty over their own bodies and strip them of current protections.

Although our society is filled with an overwhelming barrage of negative forecasts, the Emma Goldman Clinic continues to be an example of what can be done, even when significant roadblocks are placed in our path. We continue to provide the highest quality, compassionate and individualized healthcare for which we are known in Iowa and the Midwest. This annual report will provide an overview of our 2011 accomplishments.

In spite of financial and legislative challenges we are optimistic and confident. We are optimistic that there will be outrage from those who respect reproductive justice and that it will be directly reflected in the November elections. We are optimistic that by empowering the women we serve with information and compassion we are working to remove the stigma that is associated with choosing to end an unwanted or unplanned pregnancy.

We are also confident about the future. Not only are we confidently looking forward, but we are forward looking with confidence. We plan to increase our outreach to those most in need. The clinic will begin specialty services for teens; including clothes-on exams. We will also be expanding our outreach to individuals with diverse expressions of gender and sexuality. We will continue to work to reduce the stigma surrounding abortion by encouraging community conversations about reproductive choices. Internally, Emma Staff will work to reduce stigma by allowing women to

consider their options, tell their truths, and take control of their lives and futures.

Rose colored glasses? Perhaps. But the stakes are incredibly high and the consequences dire if we don't work to protect reproductive justice and access for the future. Ambitious? Perhaps. But who would have thought that 39 years ago, a group of young women without any business or medical training would have started and established an institution that has stood the test of time; the Emma Goldman Clinic. 

We are pleased to introduce our new Medical Director, Dr. Maureen McCue. Dr. McCue is an Adjunct Professor of Global Health at the University of Iowa and an adjunct assistant professor in International Programs. ## **Highlights**

Emma staff attended and participated at the following Conferences; Abortion Care Network, SisterSong, National Network of Abortion Funds, National Abortion Federation.

Because the National Abortion Federation conference was nearby, most of the staff were able to attend the Independent Provider Meeting, a gathering of abortion care providers from all over the U.S.

Emma staff, board members, and volunteers participated in 35 events as a part of our active Speakers Bureau, reaching out to over 1500 individuals. We emphasized outreach to teens and the Latin@ community reaching our goal to expand our services to the areas that need increased access to reproductive health care and education. Staff presented at the 2011 Strengthening and Valuing Latin@ Communities in Iowa Conference, held in Muscatine Iowa.

In conjunction with many teen centered education events the clinic rolled out our first teen only services package. We now have affordable exams for the under 18 age group offering confidential clothes-on exams that can be customized to meet individual teen Exams can include STI and HIV testing, birth control, health history and vitals check, Emma products, as well as sexual health education and answers to sex and sexuality questions.

We continue to update and modernize our clinic aesthetics. Last year brought changes and new furniture to our client waiting area and board room. This year we focused on clinic artwork and the abortion care recovery room.
