Pro-life organizations to protest Planned Parenthood reopening in El Paso

EL PASO, Texas (KTSM) - The Southwest Coalition for Life and other faith-based pro-life organizations will gather in Downtown El Paso on Friday to protest Planned Parenthood returning to El Paso.

As <u>KTSM previously reported</u>, the non-profit women's health clinic is expected to begin providing services this month at its facility located at 1151 E. Missouri.

Members of the Southwest Coalition for Life say Planned Parenthood "brings scandal to our city" and accuse the organization of scheduling sex-selective abortions, accepting donations to target minorities, and more.

The organization also says Planned Parenthood facilities cause "a loss of local business commerce and declining property values due to public sentiment, frequent protests, prayer vigils, and public demonstrations inevitably held outside of their facilities".
