Sarah Prager, MD, MAS Professor and Division Chief

Dr. Prager is Professor in the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology and Adjunct Professor of Health Services at the UW School of Public Health. Dr. Prager received her MD degree from the University of Texas, Southwestern Medical School, completed a residency at Fletcher Allen Health Care at the University of Vermont, and received post-graduate fellowship training and a Master of Science degree at University of California San Francisco. Dr. Prager is board certified in Obstetrics and Gynecology. Dr. Prager is very involved in the American Congress of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOG) and currently serves as the Washington State ACOG chair and the chair of the ACOG Committee on Healthcare for Underserved Women. Her research foci include immediate postpartum initiation of long-acting reversible contraceptives (LARC) and improving access to outpatient miscarriage management.
