Research/Academic Interests

Dr. Schwarz is an internationally recognized health services researcher whose work has centered on the use of technology to promote health, improving pregnancy outcomes through innovative approaches to family planning service delivery, and quantifying the effects of lactation on maternal health. These areas of inquiry are interrelated in seeking to broaden understanding of the ways social policies and healthcare delivery systems affect health-related behaviors and long-term health outcomes.

Dr. Schwarz has a particular interest in identifying ways to better meet the needs of diverse and vulnerable populations, including women with chronic medical conditions and other underserved populations.

Dr. Schwarz has served as a Senior Medical Expert in Reproductive Health for the US Department of Veterans Affairs, medical consultant for the California Department of Healthcare Services' Office of Family Planning, as a Deputy Editor for the Journal of General Internal Medicine, Associate Editor of Journal Watch Womens Health, and as a member of the FDA's Advisory Committee on Reproductive Health Drugs. She is a Fellow of the Society of Family Planning, and past-chair of the Society of General Internal Medicine's Taskforce on Women's Health.
