was given Motrin ½ hour prior to the procedure. In the room, Dr. Riley told her to put her hand over her mouth so she did not scare the other patients. Dr. Riley denied telling because that is a forbidden word at work, as well as in her own home.

After was taken to the recovery room, Dr. Riley spoke with both and discussed the minimal tissue obtained and the need for another ultrasound. At no time, did either or express any dissatisfaction with Dr. Riley.

Dr. Riley talked with When Dr. Riley asked her if she had had sex, when she was only with Dr. Riley, told her that she "might have had sex." Dr. Riley wondered if had become pregnant again, as she said a woman can get pregnant during 2 weeks – 1 month after taking the pill. However, when was in the room, denied having sex.

Dr. Riley subsequently made arrangements for to be seen in the ER at for another ultrasound. She spoke later with and told him she questioned compliance with taking the pills.
