As a minimum the record shall include: 1. Application for employment that contains information regarding education, experience and, if applicable, registration and/or licensure information of the applicant. The review of nine personnel records was conducted. Eight of the nine personnel records did not include written documentation to assure the files were current. Examples were: Two of nine personnel records lacked job descriptions. Seven of nine personnel records did not include current evaluations/appraisals to assure continued competency to meet the needs of each patient.
