6	SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT AND ORDER FILED			
7	I. PARTIES			
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9	This Settlement Agreement and Order ("Agreement and Order") is made by and			
10	between Daniel K. Curtis, D.O., Investigative Board Member ("Dr. Curtis" or "Investigative			
11	Board Member") for the Nevada State Board of (Osteopathic Medicine ("the Board") through		
12	the Board's Counsel/Executive Director, Dianna Hegeduis, Esq., and Martin Roitman, D.O.			
13	("Dr. Roitman") (collectively referred to as "the Parties").			
14	II. <u>RECITALS</u>			
15	As a preamble to this Agreement, the Parties	agree to the following:		
16	A. WHEREAS, the Board, through the Investigative Board Member ("IBM"), ascertained			
17	certain information regarding litigation filed against Dr. Roitman. The information was ascertained as a result of the Board's staff due diligence in investigating its

25	C. NRS 633.527(1) states that a licensed "or	steopathic physician shall report to the

any action or claim described in paragraphs (a) or (b) not later than 45 days after the settlement, award, judgment or other disposition; and (d) any sanctions imposed against the osteopathic physician that are reportable to the National Practitioner Data Bank not later than 45 days after the sanctions are imposed. NRS 633.527(2) states that should the Board find "that an osteopathic physician has violated any provision of this section, the Board may impose a fine of not more than \$5,000 against the osteopathic physician for each violation, in addition to any other fines or penalties permitted by law." (Emphasis added.) This statute was added to the law in 2003. By the use of the word "shall" by the Nevada State Legislature in this statute, the Legislature intended to mandatorily require all osteopathic physicians to report any of the four (4) events mentioned in the statute.

- D. NRS 633.131(1) defines "unprofessional conduct" as including "willfully making a false ... statement ... in applying for a license to practice osteopathic medicine or in applying for renewal of a license to practice osteopathic medicine." Pursuant to NRS 633.511(1), "unprofessional conduct" is a ground for initiating a formal disciplinary proceeding; and such discipline may include public reprimands, the suspension or revocation of the license to practice osteopathic medicine in the State of Nevada, and an assessment of a fine not to exceed \$5,000 per violation.
- E. NRS 622.400(1) states that a "regulatory body [such as this Board] may recover from a person reasonable attorney's fees and costs that are incurred by the regulatory body as part of its investigative, administrative and disciplinary proceedings against the person if the regulatory body" either enters a final order or enters into a settlement agreement.
- F. WHEREAS, the parties have agreed to settle this matter, rather than requiring the Board to file a formal disciplinary complaint.
- G. WHEREAS, the parties understand that this Agreement will be signed by the respective parties and will then be offered to the Board for the entire Board's approval at the next Board meeting, with the recommendation of the IBM that this matter be settled. The Agreement shall not become effective until it has been approved by a majority of the Board and endorsed by a representative member of the Board.
- H. WHEREAS, Dr. Roitman understands that the Board is free to accept or reject this Agreement and, if rejected by the Board, a formal disciplinary complaint may be filed and a hearing scheduled on the same. The Board members who review this matter for approval of this Agreement may be the same members who ultimately hear the disciplinary complaint if this Agreement is not approved by the Board. Dr. Roitman hereby agrees to waive any rights he might have to challenge the impartiality of the Board to hear the disciplinary complaint, based on prior knowledge obtained by the Board through consideration of this Agreement, if after review by the Board, this Agreement is rejected. Furthermore, if the Board does not accept the Agreement, it shall be regarded as null and void.
- WHEREAS, Dr. Roitman acknowledges that the Board will retain jurisdiction over this
 matter until all terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement and Order have been
 met to the satisfaction of the Board.
- J. WHEREAS, Dr. Roitman acknowledges that the Board had a reasonable basis to believe that the statutes and/or regulations regulating the practice of Osteopathic Medicine in the State of Nevada may have been violated.
- K. WHEREAS, in order to resolve the matter prior to it becoming a disciplinary proceeding and to save further costs and expenses, Dr. Roitman has elected to enter into this Agreement to resolve this matter, and this matter only.

- L. WHEREAS, Dr. Roitman acknowledges that once accepted by the Board, this Agreement and all associated documentation become a matter of public record (with the exception of medical information related to the patient).
- M. WHEREAS, Dr. Roitman has had the opportunity to obtain the advice from competent counsel of his choice concerning the terms and conditions of this Agreement and the execution thereof. No coercion has been exerted upon Dr. Roitman, nor have any promises been made other than those reflected in this Agreement. Dr. Roitman freely and voluntarily entered into this agreement, motivated only by a desire to resolve the issues addressed herein. Dr. Roitman has executed this Agreement only after a careful reading of it and a full understanding of all its terms.
- N. WHEREAS, Dr. Roitman is fully aware of his rights to contest the charges pending against him. These rights include: representation by an attorney at his own expense, the right to a public hearing on any charges or allegations filed, the right to confront and cross-examine witnesses called to testify against him, the right to present evidence on his own behalf, the right to compulsory process to secure the attendance of such witnesses, the right to testify on his own behalf, the right to receive written findings of fact and conclusions of law supporting the decision on the merits of the complaint and the right to obtain judicial review of the Board's decision. Should the Board accept this Agreement, Dr. Roitman voluntarily waives these rights.
- O. WHEREAS, this Agreement and Order shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Nevada.
- P. WHEREAS, this Agreement and Order contains a complete description of the agreement between the parties and it supersedes any previous agreements between the parties. All material representations, understandings and promises of the parties are contained in this Agreement. Any modifications must be set forth in writing, signed by all the parties, and approved by the Board.

III. TERMS OF THE AGREEMENT

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- A. Dr. Roitman acknowledges that the failure to report allegations are true, and each such act (failure to timely report and/or inaccurate information in renewal applications) is a violation of NRS chapter 633 for which discipline is permissible under Nevada law. In exchange for the Board not pursuing an administrative action on either the non-reporting allegations or the inaccurate information allegations, and Dr. Roitman not pursuing subsequent reviews by the appropriate appellate Courts. the parties have agreed to resolve the current matter, and only this matter. Dr. Roitman will henceforth insure that all lawsuits involving him will be timely and accurately reported to the Board, and the failure to do so may result in the Board bringing a disciplinary action against the osteopathic medical license issued by the Board to Dr. Roitman. If any lawsuit is not reported to the Board, such will be in violation of this agreement as well as the applicable statutes. ADDITIONALLY, THE BOARD ACKNOWLEDGES, AND THE PARTIES DO HEREBY AGREE. THAT A DISCIPLINARY ACTION WILL NOT AND HAS NOT BEEN FILED BY THE BOARD; AND THAT THE PARTIES HAVE SIMPLY AGREED TO AN ADMINISTRATIVE FINE BEING ASSESSED SOLELY FOR THE NON-REPORTING VIOLATION.
- B. Dr. Roitman agrees to pay the sum of One Thousand, Two Hundred, Fifty Dollars (\$1,250.00) as the fine imposed for having violated NRS 633.527(1) for the failure to timely report the settlement of the lawsuit. This sum <u>includes</u> all fees and costs incurred by the Board up to and including the approval of this settlement agreement

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1		by the Board at its next scheduled board meeting pursuant to NAC
		633.470(2)(b)(6). Such amount shall be payable in monthly installments of \$250.00
2		each with the first payment being due on the day of
3		said amount is paid in full.
4	G.	Should Dr. Roitman fail to satisfy and pay the indebtedness of \$1,250.00 in a timely manner as discussed herein, Dr. Roitman understands and agrees that he will be
		considered in default of this Agreement, and this agreement will be null and void,
5		with the Respondent receiving credit for payments made to date. The Board may
6		take whatever action it deems appropriate, including but not limited to reducing the balance to judgment pursuant to NRS chapter 353C.
7	D.	The Respondent, Dr. Roitman, agrees to bear his own fees and costs, including the
0		fees and expenses of his own attorney(s) if applicable.
8	E.	This Agreement and Order shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon each of the parties hereto and their respective heirs, personal representatives, assigns and
9] _	successors in interest of each party.
0	F.	This Agreement and Order shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Nevada.
11	G.	This settlement agreement consists of six (6) pages and embodies the entire
12		agreement between the Board and the osteopathic physician. It may not be altered, amended or modified without the express consent of the parties, and any
		subsequent alteration, amendment, or modification shall be in writing and subject to

14	П.	In consideration for the execution of this Agreement, Dr. Roitman hereby releases and forever discharges the State of Nevada, the Board of Osteopathic Medicine,
15		and the Attorney General's Office (as counsel for the Board), and each of their
		representatives, investigators, and employees, in their individual and representative
16		capacity (collectively the State of Nevada Agencies) from any and all manner of actions, causes of actions, suits, debts, judgments, executions, claims, and
17		demands whatsoever known or unknown, in law and in equity, that he may have
18		had, now has, may have had, or claim to have against any and all of the persons
		and entities named in this paragraph arising out of, or by reason of, the investigation of the allegations raised in this matter, and other matters relating thereto.
19	1.	Dr. Roitman, for himself, his heirs, executors, administrators, successors and
20		assigns, hereby indemnifies and holds harmless the State of Nevada, the Nevada State Board of Osteopathic Medicine, the Nevada State Attorney General's office
21		and each of their members, agents and employees in their individual and
22		representative capacities against any and all claims, suits, demands, actions, debts,
		damages, costs, charges, and expenses, including court costs and attorney's fees against any persons or entities as well as all liability, losses, and damages of any
23		nature whatsoever that the persons and entities named in this paragraph shall have
24		or may at any time sustain or suffer by reason of this investigation, this settlement or its administration.
25	J.	This document may be prepared in multiple counterparts. Each counterpart,
26		whether it be originally typed, a carbon, photocopy, facsimile or other type of copy,
		shall be deemed an original hereof if executed by each of the Parties hereto.
