HOLOCOST RELATED NEWS BITS

■ In Safford, Arizona the remains of three babies were found in a recently purchased storage locker. Authorities said they had been there for at least eight years.

■ Good news from the Golden Gate: Daly City's Planned Parenthood clinic will be closing at the end of May.

■ Melbourne, Florida on May thirteenth a newborn baby girl was found buried in a back yard. The mother, fifteen years old, admitted to giving birth to the baby at least a week earlier and burying her. She said the baby was stillborn.

■ The organization Voice of the Unborn wants to create a "Monument to the Unborn" on the grounds of the Statehouse in North Carolina. Presently the resolution is still in committee.

■ Paul Harvey has withdrawn from being the keynote speaker at the Quincy University's commencement ceremony for personal reasons. Possibly because two pro-life organizations: the American Life League, and the Cardinal Newman Society, had threatened to protest if the pro-abortion spoke at the Catholic university.

■ Professor Greenfield of Oxford University, who is also the director of the Royal Institute, has said there is evidence that the conscious mind of a baby might develop before 24 weeks, which is the age limit for abortion in England.

■ Representative Leo Berman has presented the Fetal Pain Protection Act (HB 569) to the House State Affairs Committee in Texas. This bill would require doctors to tell women that after 20 weeks the baby feels pain and to give them the option of anesthetizing the baby before tearing her arms and

legs off. Rep. Berman hopes this will turn some women away from abortion.

■ Katie & Leopold? Apparently many women are still looking for a REAL MAN. The Bozen Museum, where the body of the Iceman discovered in the Italian Alps in 1991 is exhibited, has received many requests from women wanting to have the Iceman's babies.

■ The child population in Japan has been dropping for 22 years. Children represent 14.1 percent of the population while the elderly make up 18.5 percent. Their bean counters are having a growing pension costs problem.

■ In California, a full-term baby boy was found floating in the Marina Del Rey Channel at the beginning of May.

■ Liem Sat Nio was convicted of attempted murder in Philadelphia on May 2nd. She had given birth to her son at work then dumped him in the trash.

■ In late April, an 18-year-old in New Jersey gave birth to a little girl, then dumped her in a trash can. A neighbor heard the baby crying and found her alive.

■ A new study from George Mason University links a rise in sexually transmitted diseases with the legalization of abortion. Professor Thomas Stratman says the study shows that when a state legalized abortion, it had an accompanying rise in STD's.

■ More good news from Sacramento: the Medical Board of California has revoked the license of San Bernadino butcher Philip B. Pierre Louis, M.D.

■ Pro-lifers have filed a civil-rights lawsuit against the Los Angeles Sheriff's Department. Deputies had detained two members of the Center for Bio-Ethical Reform who were driving a truck displaying pictures of aborted babies near the Dodson Middle School.


The activists were detained for 90 minutes, had their vehicles searched, and were told not to return to the school. *Continued on Page 28*

- A similar story: in Michigan Ron Brock will receive \$44,707.17 in damages and attorney fees from the city of Royal Oak. In August of 2001 the police had pulled Ron over in his motor home which was emblazoned with pictures of aborted babies, searched his vehicle, confiscated his property and impounded the vehicle as evidence of obscene literature. Federal Judge Paul Gadola also signed an order to keep the police from interfering with Ron's work in the future.
- Good news from the east coast. Jian Yu a Massachusetts butcher has been suspended. Among other reasons, he is accused of not maintaining a sterilized office and equipment.
- Bill AB 996 was approved by the California State Assembly Committee in early May. Should this become law, it would make interfering with an employee or a patient at an abortion clinic a hate crime in California.
- NEVER GIVE UP! South Africa: A baby boy, four months premature, held on to life after his mother dumped him in the back seat of a car at a body shop. She had apparently sought an abortion, then took something to induce labor.
- The Gov. of North Carolina has signed legislation to repeal a law the state has used to perform thousands of involuntary sterilization's. Gov. Easley expressed regret to the victims and families of this part of the states past.
- On April 10th The interior Minister of Taiwan proposed 'goodwill abortions' for pregnant women being held as illegal immigrants from China.
- Indiana's Informed Consent law took effect on May 1st after eight years of bantering. This law requires a woman to take two trips to the clinic. On the first they would be read state-mandated information about the procedure and alternatives to abortion. Then return, at least 18 hours later, to have their child dismembered.
- Mayor Bloomberg's veto of legislation requiring city contracted hospitals to provide 'emergency contraception' to rape victims has been overridden by the New York City Council. For more information on this: <http://www.lifesite.net/ldn/2003/apr/0304/1104.html>
- New York: on May 15th a Nassau County court jury found Kathleen E. Brown guilty of the murder of her newborn son. On Christmas day 2001 she left her family at the dinner table and went to her room. There she delivered her baby boy. Then she apparently strangled him, put him in a plastic bag and hid him under her bed for more than a day.
- From across the pond: Miss Fiona Pinto, a candidate for the Pro-life Alliance at the Welsh Assembly elections in Newport, Wales, was arrested for showing a picture of one of GOD's slaughtered children while campaigning.

- Gov. Tim Pawlenty signed a bill into law in April known as the 'Woman's Right to know'. This bill requires that the doctor tells the woman of the medical risks, the gestation age of her baby, and that financial assistance might be available from the state and the father. Also, the woman must wait 24 hours before having her baby dismembered.
