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On August 7, 2002, the Board's Case Resolution Conference ("CRC") convened to address the Respondent's request for termination of the Consent Order. On that date, the CRC concluded that the Respondent satisfactorily completed the terms and conditions imposed in the Consent Order and should be licensed to practice medicine without conditions.

## FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Respondent's license to practice medicine in the State of Maryland was subject to terms and conditions pursuant to the Consent Order dated May 25, 2001.
2. The Board received documentation indicating that the Respondent had successfully complied with the conditions set forth in the May 25, 2001, Consent Order.
3. On August 7, 2002, the Respondent appeared before the Board's CRC with a request for termination of the Consent Order.

4. On August 7, 2002, the CRC authorized the termination of the Consent Order based upon the Respondent's compliance with the terms of the Order dated May 25, 2001.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the foregoing Finding of Fact, the Board concludes that as a matter of law, the Respondent has complied with the conditions and terms imposed in the May 25, 2001, Consent Order


#### ORDER
