AB154 was just signed into law by Governor Brown on



October 9th. The law will allow advanced practice clinicians (Nurse Practitioners, Nurse Midwives, and Physician Assistants) to perform first trimester aspiration abortions. **Debbie Bamberger, MS, WHNP-BC** - Planned Parenthood Shasta Pacific: Debbie Bamberger, MS, WHNP-BC, is a women's health nurse practitioner and the lead clinician at PP Shasta Pacific's El Cerrito Health Center. Debbie has been a clinician for 19 years and has had lots of interesting roles—from teaching OB/GYN residents how to do difficult Norplant removals, to working on clinical trials for rings, patches and IUCs, to being the first clinician in California to be legally trained to provide first trimester aspiration abortions. Debbie was in the first-ever UCSF MEPN class in 1991.

**Sierra Harris, MAWH** - ACCESS Women's Health Justice: Sierra joined ACCESS in May 2010 as a Policy Advocacy and Healthline intern. Sierra is a Bay Area native, but moved to the East Coast with her mom and two younger sisters when she was 12. She graduated from the University of Connecticut with a B.A. in English and Women's Studies and Suffolk University with an MA in Women's Health. Sierra has been dedicated to social justice nonprofits since college and has worked at the Windham AIDS Program, the Center for Women's Health and Human Rights, and Breast Cancer Action. At ACCESS, Sierra manages the Healthline and Policy priorities. She lives in Oakland with her partner, and her bull dog. In her spare time, Sierra enjoys cooking and hosting family dinners- a space she believes cultivates community outside the activism sphere.

**Diana Taylor, RNP, PhD, FAAN**, is Professor Emerita at the University of California-San Francisco (UCSF) School of Nursing and formerly the Director of UCSF's Women's Health NP Program, as well as the co-Director of the UCSF Center for Collaborative Primary Care to advance interprofessional collaboration and innovation related to primary care education, practice and research. Dr. Taylor received her BSN from the University of Oregon, her MS from UCSF and PhD from the University of Washington. Dr. Taylor is the director of a statewide project to train and evaluate the safety of advanced practice clinicians in first trimester abortion care using a standardized curriculum with the goal to increase the number abortion providers and make professional and practice improvements to normalize abortion into women's primary care.
