COMPLAINT AND JURY DEMAND

NOW COMES Plaintiff, BIANCA SOMERVILLE, by and through attorneys, HERTZ SCHRAM PC and for her Complaint against Defendants, states as follows:

COUNT I [FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS]

- 1. Plaintiff, BIANCA SOMERVILLE [hereinafter known as "BIANCA"] is a resident of the city of Detroit, county of Wayne, and state of Michigan.
- 2. Defendant VHS SINAI-GRACE HOSPITAL, INC., d/b/a SINAI-GRACE HOSPITAL [hereinafter known as "SINAI-GRACE"] is a foreign profit corporation conducting business at 6071 West Outer Drive, Detroit, Michigan 48235.
- 3. SINAI-GRACE has as its registered agent, THE CORPORATION COMPANY, and registered address of 30600 Telegraph Rd., Bingham Farms, MI 48025.
- 4. Defendant ALEX PICKENS, M.D. [hereinafter known as "DR. PICKENS"] is a licensed physician in the state of Michigan.
- 5. DR. PICKENS was at all times relevant herein an employee and/or agent of SINAI-GRACE acting within the scope of same.
- 6. Defendant SUMMIT OF DETROIT, P.C., d/b/a SUMMIT MEDICAL CENTER [hereinafter known as "SUMMIT"] is a domestic professional service corporation conducting business at 15801 West McNichols, Detroit, Michigan 48235.
- 7. SUMMIT has as its registered agent, CSC-LAWYERS INCORPORATING SERVICE (COMPANY), and registered address of 601 Abbot Rd., East Lansing, MI 48223.
- 8. Defendant REGINALD SHARPE, M.D. [hereinafter known as "DR. SHARPE"] is a licensed physician in the state of Michigan.
- 9. DR. SHARPE was at all times relevant herein an employee and/or agent of SUMMIT acting within the scope of same.

- 10. Pursuant to MCL 600.2912b, Defendants were provided with the required Notice of Intent dated May 21, 2015.
- 11. The incident occurred in the city of Detroit, county of Wayne, and state of Michigan.
 - 12. That venue is proper pursuant to MCL 600.1629.
- 13. The amount in controversy exceeds Twenty-five Thousand (\$25,000.00) Dollars.
- 14. At the time of these events, BIANCA was a twenty-three (23) year old woman.
 - 15. BIANCA has been pregnant twice.
- 16. BIANCA'S first pregnancy resulted in the birth of her twin daughters on November 4, 2011, at Hutzel Hospital.
- 17. BIANCA realized she was pregnant again in early December 2014 after she started feeling nauseous and light-headed at work.
- 18. BIANCA went to the Emergency Room at Henry Ford Hospital where she was advised that she was pregnant.
 - 19. BIANCA made the decision to voluntarily terminate the pregnancy.
 - 20. BIANCA went to SUMMIT on December 22, 2014.
 - 21. BIANCA filled out the paperwork.
 - 22. BIANCA scheduled the abortion for the next day.
 - 23. BIANCA arrived late to the clinic on December 23, 2014.
 - 24. The clinic was unable to perform the procedure.
 - 25. The procedure was rescheduled for the following week.

- 26. BIANCA had an appointment at SUMMIT on December 31, 2014, at 10:00 a.m.
 - 27. BIANCA met DR. SHARPE, who gave her pills to take.
- 28. DR. SHARPE advised her to put them in her upper mouth and let them dissolve.
 - 29. BIANCA then waited for an hour to have the procedure.
- 30. BIANCA indicated the pills had not completely dissolved prior to the procedure.
- 31. An ultrasound was performed and BIANCA was advised that she was approximately sixteen weeks pregnant.
- 32. Due to this, BIANCA was advised that the procedure may take longer and they needed to wait until the pills were fully dissolved.
 - 33. Finally, BIANCA was prepped for the surgery.
 - 34. DR. SHARPE and a nurse came into the room.
- 35. Another ultrasound was performed and DR. SHARPE gave her medication in her arm.
 - 36. DR. SHARPE started the procedure.
- 37. BIANCA immediately felt excruciating pain and started crying and screaming.
- 38. Two nurses had to hold her legs up in the air so DR. SHARPE could continue the procedure.
- 39. DR. SHARPE stopped the procedure to let BIANCA rest because she was in so much pain.

- 40. BIANCA was in a lot of pain and was bleeding while she waited.
- 41. BIANCA requested pain medication before DR. SHARPE continued the procedure.
- 42. DR. SHARPE restarted the procedure by using a suction device which was still very painful.
- 43. BIANCA indicated that the doctor pulled something out and asked the nurse "is that it?"
- 44. DR. SHARPE then continued to try to get the remainder out but was unable to do so.
 - 45. An employee at SUMMIT called EMS.
 - 46. BIANCA was taken to SINAI-GRACE.
- 47. BIANCA was diagnosed with an incomplete abortion with retained products of conception.
- 48. BIANCA was advised that the procedure would be completed by a doctor at SINAI-GRACE.
 - 49. DR. PICKENS was assigned to complete the abortion procedure.
 - 50. BIANCA was taken for emergency surgery.
- 51. DR. PICKENS performed an examination under anesthesia, attempted dilation and evacuation, cystoscopy, diagnostic laparoscopy, exploratory laparotomy, repair of cystotomy by Urological team, repair of right round ligament laceration, hysterotomy and removal of retained products of conception.
 - 52. BIANCA'S uterus was perforated.
 - 53. BIANCA'S bladder was extensively injured.

- 54. It was discovered that BIANCA lost about two-thirds of her bladder during the procedure.
- 55. Jason Wynberg, M.D. performed a limited exploratory laparotomy, identified the bilateral uterus and then performed a primary closure of the bladder.
 - 56. A Foley catheter was inserted along with stents placed in her kidneys.
 - 57. The surgery took approximately five hours to complete.
- 58. After the surgery was completed, BIANCA was in the ICU on a ventilator for 7-10 days.
- 59. BIANCA'S condition stabilized and she was finally discharged on January 16, 2015.
 - 60. BIANCA followed up with Dr. Weinberg.
- 61. On January 25, 2015, BIANCA had the stent removed but had to continue wearing the catheter.
- 62. BIANCA had tubes placed in her kidneys at SINAI-GRACE on February 3, 2015.
 - 63. BIANCA'S bladder capacity is estimated in the 150 mL range.
 - 64. BIANCA is still receiving medical care due to the injuries she sustained.
- 65. Due to the negligence and breaches of the standard of care by DR. PICKENS, SINAI-GRACE, DR. SHARPE, and SUMMIT, BIANCA'S abortion procedure was performed in a negligent manner, which resulted in a perforated uterus and ruptured bladder.
- 66. BIANCA required additional surgery, a Foley catheter, and stents placed into her kidneys.

- 67. In addition to the perforated uterus and ruptured bladder, BIANCA experienced pain, suffering, discomfort, humiliation, fear, shock, additional surgery, disfigurement, fright, residual scarring, additional medical care and treatment, hospitalization, depression, loss of enjoyment of life, lost wages, and other economic loss.
 - 68. BIANCA has also suffered damage to her reproductive system.
- 69. Had DR. PICKENS, SINAI-GRACE, DR. SHARPE, and SUMMIT, complied with the standard of care, BIANCA would not have suffered said damages.

WHEREFORE Plaintiff, BIANCA SOMERVILLE, by and through counsel HERTZ SCHRAM PC, claims judgment against the Defendants in an amount in excess of Twenty-five Thousand (\$25,000.00) Dollars plus costs, fees and interest.

 - a. by failing to have the ability to meet the patient's needs;
 - b. by failing to perform an abortion procedure in a safe and cautious manner;

THE MANNER IN WHICH THE BREACH OF THE STANDARD OF PRACTICE OR CARE WAS THE PROXIMATE CAUSE OF INJURY:

Due to the negligence and breaches of the standard of care by Alex Pickens, M.D., Sinai-Grace Hospital, Reginald Sharpe, M.D., and Summit Medical Center, Bianca Somerville's abortion procedure was performed in a negligent manner, which resulted in a perforated uterus and ruptured bladder. Bianca also required additional surgery, a Foley catheter and stents placed into her kidneys.

In addition to the perforated uterus and ruptured bladder, Bianca experienced pain, suffering, discomfort, humiliation, fear, shock, additional surgery, disfigurement, fright, residual scarring, additional medical care and treatment, hospitalization, depression, loss of enjoyment of life, lost wages, and other economic loss. Bianca has also suffered damage to her reproductive system.

Had Alex Pickens, M.D. Sinai-Grace Hospital, Reginald Sharpe, M.D., and Summit Medical Center, complied with the standard of care, Bianca Somerville would not have suffered said damages.
