### Evidence-Based Abortion Care: A Team-Based Learning Experience

How well do you work on a team? Emerging research shows that highest quality care is delivered, not by individual providers, but by teams of physicians, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, and other clinical staff working in partnership.

For teams to work together successfully, there must be good communication and effective problem solving. Working well as a member of a team is often a learned skill. Practice your team-based care at this preconference workshop. The session will cover medication abortion, MVA simulation, abortion counseling, and follow up care through a team-based learning framework.

#### **Participants will:**

- ▶ Review a short syllabus prior to the session
- ▶ Demonstrate their knowledge as individuals and as part of a team
- ▶ Apply their knowledge to case studies and patient issues
- ▶ Participate in small group discussion
- ▶ Share and defend team solutions to the large group
- ▶ Practice performing MVA using a papaya simulated model

Bring your clinical colleagues and brush up your team dynamics or get matched with a practice team for the session. Either way, be prepared for some impactful learning.

### Ultrasound 101

Learn ultrasound fundamentals and the basics of dating first and second trimester pregnancies. The session will also focus on placental location for second trimester abortions, IUD location, and endometrial thickness. The hands-on practicum will provide an opportunity to work with ultrasound machines and patient simulations. The session goal is not to train participants to be “ultrasonographers,” but to provide an introduction to ultrasound technology and a better understanding of ultrasound principles.

### Pearls for Clinician Managers: Coding, Credentialing, and Performance Measurement

Is your practice being administered as efficiently and effectively as possible? This highly practical session will cover three key topics in practice administration:

- ▶ CPT and ICD Coding - Review the fundamentals of coding for office visits and procedures and test your coding skills with several case studies. Material will be presented in a “training of trainers” format so you can pass these skills on to the clinicians in your practice.
- ▶ Performance Measures - Improve quality of care with effective performance measures. Review and analyze your performance reports used by outside entities (such as payers) and learn to collect required chart review data efficiently for the Title X program and others.
- ▶ Credentialing and Privileging - Assess how your practice credentials the clinicians that you employ and grants privileging for specific procedures. Lessons learned from JCAHO regulations for hospital medical staff privileging will be applied to clinicians who provide only out-patient services.
