Dear Dr. Cannon:

In accordance with Sections 54.1-105, 54.1-110 and 9-6.14:12 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended ("Code"), you are hereby given notice that the Virginia Board of Medicine ("Board") will convene and act upon evidence that you may have violated certain laws governing the practice of medicine in Virginia, as set forth in the attached Statement of Particulars. Pursuant to the Board's notice dated August 26, 1992, you were previously scheduled for a formal administrative hearing, which was continued generally on September 14, 1992 at your request, pending the outcome of your appeal of the decision of the Medical Board of California.


The formal administrative hearing will be held in accordance with the provisions of Sections 54.1-2400 and 9-6.14:14.1F of the Code, before a panel of the Board, with a member of the Board presiding. You have been scheduled to appear before the Board on Friday, June 7, 1996, at 8:30 a.m., at the offices of the Department of Health Professions, 6606 West Broad Street, Richmond, Virginia. Please register with the receptionist on the fourth floor, who will direct you to the exact location of your hearing. Please be seated in the waiting area and you will be called when the Board is ready to meet with you. A map is enclosed for your convenience.

You have the following rights, among others: to be represented by legal counsel, to have witnesses subpoenaed on your behalf, to present documentary evidence and to cross-examine adverse witnesses. Should you wish to subpoena witnesses, requests for subpoenas must be made in writing in accordance with the enclosed Instructions for Requesting Subpoenas. Should you wish to present materials at this meeting, please have fifteen (15) copies ready for distribution.

Should you or Assistant Attorney General Frank W. Pedrotty wish to make prehearing motions, each of you is directed to file motions in writing, addressed to me at the Board office, at least ten (10) business days prior to this hearing. Further, to facilitate this hearing, the Board requests that you provide to Mr. Pedrotty, 900 East Main Street, Richmond, Virginia 23219, copies of any documents you intend to introduce into evidence, at least ten (10) business days before the hearing.

Please indicate, by letter to this office, your intention to be present.



STATEMENT OF PARTICULARS

The Board alleges that Mahlon Douglas Cannon, M.D., may have violated Section 54.1-2915.A(6) of the Code, in that on June 10, 1991, the Division of Medical Quality of the Medical Board of California revoked Dr. Cannon's license to practice medicine and prohibited him from supervising a physician's assistant, effective July 10, 1991, pursuant to findings by an Administrative Law Judge that he was guilty of unprofessional conduct as set forth in the Decision and Proposed Decision, copies of which are attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein.
