**ORDER** 

In accordance with the provisions of Sections 54.1-2919 and 9-6.14:11 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as

amended ("Code"), an informal conference was held with Mahlon D. Cannon, M.D., on December 11, 1997, in

Richmond, Virginia. Members of the Virginia Board of Medicine ("Board") serving on the Informal Conference

Committee ("Committee") were: Anthony Moore, Chairman; Cheryl Jordan, M.D.; and Paul M. Spector, D.O. Dr.

Cannon appeared personally and was represented by counsel, Robert J. Wagner, Esquire. The purpose of the informal

conference was to review Dr. Cannon's compliance with the terms and conditions imposed upon his license to practice

medicine in the Commonwealth of Virginia by Order of the Board entered on June 21, 1996.

FINDINGS OF FACT

Now, having considered the evidence and testimony presented, the Committee makes the following Findings

of Fact:

1. Dr. Cannon is in compliance with the Board Order dated June 21, 1996, with the exception of term

1.c.

2. Dr. Cannon successfully completed the continuing medical education required by the Board's Order

dated June 21, 1996.

3. Dr. Cannon is an active participant in the Learning Program in the Three Rivers Health District with

the Virginia Department of Health.

**CONCLUSIONS OF LAW** 

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact, the Committee concludes that Dr. Cannon is properly before the

Committee and has violated term 1.c. of the Order of the Board entered June 21, 1996.

**ORDER** 

WHEREFORE, it is hereby ORDERED that this matter be, and hereby is CONTINUED GENERALLY for six

(6) months under the following terms and conditions:

1. Dr. Cannon shall successfully pass the SPEX examination or a Board approved equivalent

examination in his specialty that tests a broad range of knowledge.

2. Dr. Cannon shall maintain a course of conduct in his practice of medicine commensurate with

requirements of Chapter 29, Title 54.1 of the Code, as well as all other laws of the Commonwealth.

If Dr. Cannon successfully completes the requirements of this Order, this matter shall be dismissed.

Pursuant to Section 9-6.14:14 of the Code, the signed original of this Order shall remain in the custody of the

Department of Health Professions as a public record and shall be made available for public inspection and copying upon

request.

Pursuant to Section 54.1-2919 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended, Dr. Cannon may, not later than 5:00

p.m., on February 26, 1998, notify Warren W. Koontz, M.D., Executive Director at 6606 West Broad Street,

Richmond, Virginia 23230, in writing that he desires a hearing before the Board. Upon the filing with the Executive

Director of a request for the hearing, this Order shall be vacated.

Therefore, this Order shall become final on February 26, 1998, unless a request for a hearing is received as

described above.
