CARDIOTHORACIC SURGERY TRAINING GRANT

The U.S. Public Health Service has awarded the University of California, San Francisco, a \$210,000 grant for the first three years of an advanced training program in Cardiothoracic Surgery. The grant will support four trainees, each of whom will spend two years in a carefully planned program to equip them for an academic career covering all aspects of surgery for the heart and lungs.

The grant and the training program are under the direction of Benson B. Roe, M.D., Professor of Surgery. Four other members of the surgical faculty will be active participants; they are L. Henry Edmunds, Jr., M.D., Associate Professor of Surgery; Orville F. Grimes, M.D., Associate Professor and Vice-chairman, Department of Surgery; Noel H. Fishman, M.D., Assistant Professor of Surgery; and Richard G. Sanderson, M.D., Assistant Professor of Surgery In-residence.

Other members of the faculty in Cardiology, Radiology, Medicine, Anesthesia and Pediatrics will actively contribute to the teaching.

A REQUEST TO THE CAMPUS COMMUNITY TO OBSERVE SMOKING REGULATIONS

For the comfort and safety of patients, their families and visitors, Hospital Administration has asked that students, physicians and employees observe the smoking regulations for UCSF Hospitals and Clinics.

Campus personnel are asked to refrain from smoking in areas where there is direct contact with patients, such as X-ray, radiology, examination, treatment and patient rooms, and in conference rooms when a patient is being presented.

Visitors are also requested to observe no smoking rules in patients' rooms and in areas where there would be hazard or discomfort to a patient.

Smoking is prohibited in rooms where Oxygen is being stored or administered.

Areas where smoking is permitted include, of course, the cafeterias, waiting areas, lounges, restrooms and locker areas; enclosed charting rooms on nursing units; non-patient office areas; and non-patient care departmental space approved by the department head or supervisor.
