- Quantitative
 - Data abstraction form
 - Descriptive statistics
- Qualitative
 - Iterative process to identify themes
 - Episodes coded in video format
- Dedoose v. 4.2.81







Percentage of Episodes







Lack of Support

- ■I don't feel like doing anything today, I'm tired. I want to stay home and go to bed. (Cleondra's boyfriend)
- It really changes things not to have our family's support. But ultimately it's our decision. (Catelynn)
- As usual, my mom's boyfriend is more important than me. (Kailyn)

Sacrifice

- ■I never knew how much I was going to miss just being a regular teen. Imagine being in prison. That's what it's like, being in prison. (Jenelle)
- ■Not being able to dance my senior year really sucks. I don't see my friends as much since I quit the dance team. (Cleondra)

Disrupted Education/Career Plans

- ■I had to give up my air force dreams so that Josh could keep his...I knew having a baby meant making sacrifices, but I never imagined my career would end before I even finished high school. (Ebony)
- My biggest dream was to play the flute in the Virginia Symphony, and then I found out I was pregnant. And that dream just kind of died. I'm not doing music anymore... (Lizzie)

Embarrassment & Stigma

- ■There would be girls walking by pregnant and we would be like, 'Oh, there's another one', and now...I'm pregnant (Samantha)
- ■I worry that everyone has been avoiding me since I got pregnant. (Megan)
- ■I'm not saying you don't have respect for yourself if you're having sex, but, you know, just keep your legs closed. (Ebony's

classmate)

Conclusions

- 16 & Pregnant negatively portrays the experiences of teen parents
- Has potential to be used as entertainment-education
- Presents little information about sex, contraception, pregnancy options
 - Disconnection of sex & pregnancy
 - Silences abortion as an option
 - Neglects post-partum birth control
