## **HISTORY**

This matter comes before the hearing examiner for the State Board of Medicine (Board) on an order to show cause (OSC) filed on July 21, 2006, alleging that Larry R. Glazerman, M.D. (Respondent) is subject to disciplinary action under 903 of the Medical Care Availability and Reduction of Error (Mcare) Act, Act of March 20, 2002, P.L. 154, 40 P.S.§1303.903, as a result of failing to report to the Board within sixty days notice of a complaint in a medical professional liability action filed against him.

The Commonwealth served the OSC upon Respondent at his address via certified mail, return receipt requested on July 24, 2006. Respondent received the Order to Show Cause on July 25, 2006 as evidenced by Postal Form 3811, Article# 7000 0600 0028 9628 0125. Service of the OSC upon Respondent accorded with the requirements of § 33.31 of the General Rules of Administrative Practice and Procedure (GRAPP), 1 Pa. Code §33.31. Respondent failed to file an answer or otherwise respond to the OSC. On September 14, 2006, the Commonwealth filed a Motion to Enter Default and Deem Facts Admitted (MDFA), which was served upon Respondent at his address on file with the Board. Respondent did not respond to the MDFA.

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Respondent holds a license to practice medicine and surgery in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, license no. MD-019651-E. (Board records)
- 2. Respondent's license with the Board is active through December 31, 2006, and may be renewed thereafter upon filing of the appropriate documentation and payment of the necessary fees. (Board records)
- 3. At all times pertinent to the factual allegations, Respondent held a license to practice medicine and surgery in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. (Board records)
- 4. Respondent's address is OB-GYN At Trexlertown, P.C., 6900 Hamilton Blvd., PO Box 60, Trexlertown, PA 18087. (Board records)
- 5. On July 21, 2006, the Commonwealth filed an Order to Show Cause setting forth allegations that the Respondent violated the Medical Care Availability and Reduction of Error Act (MCARE Act). (Exhibit 1)
- 6. Pursuant to the Certificate of Service attached to the Order to Show Cause, the Commonwealth served the Order to Show Cause upon the Respondent by mailing a copy via certified mail, return receipt requested to the Respondent at the following address: OB-GYN at Trexlertown, PC, 6900 Hamilton Blvd., PO Box 60, Trexlertown, PA 18087. (Exhibit 1)
- 7. Respondent received the Order to Show Cause on July 25, 2006 as evidenced by Postal Form 3811, Article # 7000 0600 0028 9628 0125. (Exhibit 2)
- 8. The OSC directed Respondent to file an Answer to the OSC within 30 days of service of the OSC. (Docket No. 1208-49-06)

- 9. As of the date of this Motion to Enter Default and Deem Facts Admitted, the Respondent has failed to file an Answer to the Order to Show Cause. (Docket No. 1208-49-06)
- 10. On September 14, 2006, the Commonwealth filed an MDFA in this matter. (Docket No. 1208-49-06)
- 11. Respondent did not respond to the Commonwealth's MDFA. (Docket No. 1208-49-06)
- 12. Respondent was served with all pleadings, orders, and notices filed of record in this matter. (Docket No. 1208-49-06)

# **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

- 1. The Board has jurisdiction in this matter. (Findings of Fact, Nos. 1-4)
- 2. Respondent has been afforded reasonable notice of the charges against him and an opportunity to be heard in this proceeding, in accordance with the Administrative Agency Law, 2 Pa. C.S. §504. (Findings of Fact, No. 12)
- 3. Respondent violated section 903 of the Mcare Act, 40 P.S.§1303.903, as a result of failing to report to the Board within sixty days notice of a complaint in a medical professional liability action filed against him. (Findings of Fact, Nos. 4-11)
- 4. The Board is authorized to impose disciplinary or corrective measures or a civil penalty pursuant to section 908 of the Act, 40 P.S.§1303.908.

## **DISCUSSION**

## Motion for Default

The OSC was initially served on Respondent by certified mail, return receipt requested on July 24, 2006. Respondent received the certified mailing on July 25, 2006 as evidenced by Postal Form 3811, Article # 7000 0600 0028 9628 0125.

In the Notice attached to the OSC, Respondent was notified that the Commonwealth instituted formal disciplinary action against him and that failure to respond to the OSC could result in a default judgment against him. Respondent was notified that he might lose his license to practice medicine and surgery in the Commonwealth. Respondent was directed to file an answer to the allegations in the OSC within 30 days, and advised that if he did not file an answer to those allegations, disciplinary action may be taken against him without a hearing. Under a section captioned "Procedures" in the OSC, Respondent was ordered to file a written answer to the OSC within 30 days, and advised that failure to do so would result in issuance of an order imposing a penalty against his license to practice medicine and surgery.

On September 15, 2006, the Commonwealth filed a MDFA due to Respondent's failure to file an answer to the OSC within the time specified. The MDFA was sent via first class mail, postage prepaid, to Respondent's address of record with the Board. The MDFA has not been returned to the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs.

As of the date of this adjudication, Respondent has filed neither an answer to the OSC nor a response to the MDFA. Respondent is therefore in default in accordance with 1 Pa. Code §35.37, which provides in pertinent part as follows:

#### §35.37. Answers to orders to show cause.

Any person upon whom an order to show cause has been served. . shall, if directed so to do, respond to the same by filing within the time specified in the order an answer in writing. . . A respondent failing to file an answer within the time allowed shall be deemed in default, and relevant facts stated in the order to show cause may be deemed admitted.

Accordingly, under 1 Pa. Code §35.37, the Commonwealth's MDFA is granted and the allegations in the OSC are deemed admitted.

## **Violation**

This action is brought under sections 903 and 908 of the Mcare Act, 40 P.S. §§ 1303.903 and 908, which provide in pertinent:

## § 1303.903 Reporting

§ 1303.908

A physician shall report to the State Board of Medicine...within 60 days of the occurrence of any of the following:

(1) Notice of a complaint in a medical professional liability action against the physician. The physician shall provide the docket number of the case, where the case is filed and a description of the allegations in the complaint.

# Licensure board – imposed civil penalty

In addition to any other civil remedy or criminal penalty provided for in this act... the State Board of Medicine..., by a vote of the majority of the maximum number of the authorized membership of each board as provided by law or by a vote of the majority of the duly qualified and confirmed membership or a minimum of five members, whichever is greater, may levy a civil penalty of up to \$10,000 on any current licensee who violates any provision of this act, the Medical Practice Act of 1985...

\* \* \*

The Commonwealth charged in its OSC that Respondent is subject to discipline as a result of failing to report to the Board within sixty days notice of a complaint in a medical professional liability action filed against him. On March 9, 2004, a Complaint was filed in a civil suit naming Respondent as a Defendant. On September 15, 2004, the Commonwealth received notification from another source that Respondent was named as a Defendant in a civil suit. On July 24, 2006, the Commonwealth notified Respondent that he was not in compliance with the reporting requirements of section 903 of the Mcare Act. Since March 9, 2004, Respondent has failed to comply with the reporting requirements of section 903 of the Mcare Act, 40 P.S.§1303.903. There is no question that Respondent has violated section 903 of the Act; the only issue is the appropriate sanction.

Under its professional licensing statute, the Board is charged with the responsibility and authority to oversee the profession and to regulate and license professionals to protect the public health and safety. <u>Barran v. State Board of Medicine</u> 670 A.2d 765, 767 (Pa.Cmwlth. 1996), appeal denied 679 A.2d 230 (Pa. 1996). To that end, the Mcare Act requires medical doctors to report civil medical malpractice actions so that the Board, at an early stage, can determine whether a disciplinary action should follow. Self-reporting is the foundation of such a review. Respondent must be reminded of his obligation, and thus a civil penalty will be imposed.

Accordingly, based upon the above findings of fact, conclusions of law and discussion, the following order will issue.

## REHEARING AND/ORRECONSIDER ATTOM BY HEARING EXAMINER

Human state specifically and concisely, in numbered paragraphs, the grounds relied upon in seeking the Board's review of the hearing examiner's decision, including any alleged error in the adjudication. Within an application for review a party may request that the Board hear additional argument and take additional evidence.

An application to the Board to review the hearing examiner's decision may be filed irrespective of whether an application to the hearing examiner for rehearing or reconsideration is filed.

STAY OF HEARING BY AMENER'S ORDER

Neither the filing of an application for reheating and/or reconsideration nor the filing of an application for review operates as a stay of the heating examiner's order. To seek a stay of a heating's examiner's order, the party must file an application for stay directed to the heating examiner. If the heating examiner denies the stay, an application for stay directed to the Board may then be filed.

#### FILING AND SERVICE

An original and three copies of all applications shall be filed with Deanna S. Walton, Prothonotary, P O Box 2649, Harrisburg, Pennsylvania 17105-2649. A copy of applications must also be served on all parties.

Applications must be received for filing by the Prothonotary within the time limits specified. The date of receipt at the office of Prothonotary, and not the date of deposit in the mail, is determinative. The filing of an application for releasing and/or reconsideration does not extend, or in any office manner affect, the time period in which an application for review may be filed.

Code Part II, to the extent the inles are consistent with regulations promulgated by the Board or provisions of the Medical Practice Act of 1985 or the Health Care Services Malpractice Act.

Not having an afformey will not be accepted as an excuse for failing to comply with the requirements contained in these notice provisions or relevant statutes and regulations.

### COMPLAINT FOR CATASTROPHIC INJURIES AND DEMAND FOR JURY TRIAL

The Plaintiff, LISA-MARIA CARTER, by and through her undersigned attorneys, hereby sues the Defendants, Larry Roy Glazerman, M.D.; Florida Health Sciences Center, Inc., doing business as Tampa General Hospital; and the Board of Trustees of the University of South Florida operating the University of South Florida Health, doing business as University of South Florida College of Medicine, and alleges:

### **GENERAL ALLEGATIONS**

This is an action for damages in excess of the jurisdictional threshold of this
court, Fifteen Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$15,000.00), exclusive of costs, interest and
attorney fees.

### THE PARTIES

- 2. At all times material here, Plaintiff, LISA-MARIA CARTER, was a resident of Tampa, Hillsborough County, Florida, hereinafter referred to as "CARTER."
- 3. At all times material herein, Defendant, Florida Health Sciences Center, Inc., was a private corporation, doing business as Tampa General Hospital, under Chapter 395, Florida Statutes, hereinafter referred to as "TGH." In this action, attending hospitalists, critical care physicians, physician ICU managers, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, and nurses were employed by TGH, under the control of TGH, and/or acting as its agents or apparent agents of TGH, due to TGH holding these medical professionals out as its employees or agents, and all acting within their scope of their respective employment or agency.
- 4. At all times material herein, Defendant, the Board of Trustees of the University of South Florida, operates the University of South Florida Health, doing business as University of South Florida College of Medicine, in Tampa, Florida, hereinafter referred to as "USF."
- 5. At all times material herein, Defendant, USF, employed Defendant, Larry Roy Glazerman, M.D. ("GLAZERMAN"), who worked as a staff physician of TGH, with his address at Tampa General Circle, at TGH, and who CARTER met inside TGH. TGH held GLAZERMAN out as its agent or employee, and CARTER accepted treatment from GLAZERMAN in reasonable belief that the treatment was being rendered on behalf of TGH, inside TGH, with all TGH staff and nurses. Prior to his employment at USF and working at TGH, GLAZERMAN had over a dozen medical malpractice claims against him,

several for negligently perforating or transecting organs, such as that which occurred to CARTER as described below.

- At all times material herein, Defendants, USF and TGH, were operating in a 6. joint venture, operating as Partners in providing patient care at TGH to CARTER, by cooperating and collaborating together to advance their respective and common missions; to assure TGH the assignment of USF Physicians and residents to TGH to provide services in accordance with TGH's medical staff members' usual and customary responsibilities, through joint administration of patient care; where USF has mutual control with TGH over the provision of patient care at TGH; where USF provides the majority of staff physicians at TGH, such as GLAZERMAN; where TGH and USF work together for the mutual financial benefit of each other in a joint enterprise in the provision of patient care; where TGH provides the resources of TGH facilities, instruments, nursing, hospitalists, ICU managers, support staff, and employees, while USF provides physician services, such as GLAZERMAN; and where TGH held GLAZERMAN out to CARTER as an employee or agent of TGH, all for the joint effort to enhance the status of TGH and USF and financial gain for each other. The joint venture arrangement further obligates TGH and USF to cooperate with each other in the event a claim or suit is filed against TGH and/or USF concerning patient care at TGH, such as the instant action.
- 7. As a result of said injuries described below, the Plaintiff has received (and in the future will continue to receive) medical and hospital care and treatment furnished by the United States of America. The Plaintiff, for the sole use and benefit of the United States of America under the provisions of 42 U.S.C. §§ 2651-2653 and/or 10 U.S.C.

§1095, and with its express consent, asserts a claim for the reasonable value of said (past and future) care and treatment in excess of \$12 million.

- 8. Prior to filing this matter, Plaintiff has complied with all conditions precedent.
- 9. Defendants have denied the claim.

### DAY ONE- THE EVENT

÷:

- On November 1, 2010, CARTER appeared at TGH for same day outpatient surgery to remove an ovarian cyst so that she could be deployed as a private contractor, i.e., "Intelligence Analyst," for the Department of Defense to Iraq to serve the security interest of the United States of America, while she was just shy of earning full retirement with the federal government in her long and distinguished career. GLAZERMAN was the physician at TGH who could schedule CARTER's surgery at the earliest possible time so that she could achieve the next deployment scheduled to Iraq in two weeks.
- 11. GLAZERMAN represented that as the head of the department of the chosen method of surgery at TGH, laparoscopy, which he described as minimally invasive surgery with minimally adverse risks, CARTER would be discharged the same day and recover faster than traditional surgery. Based on GLAZERMAN'S position at TGH and his representation, CARTER chose him, the procedure, and outpatient services at TGH.
- 12. On November 1, 2010, GLAZERMAN performed the "minimally invasive procedure" by cutting a small incision through CARTER's navel, and proceeded with the procedure with facilities, instruments and nursing support staff provided by TGH.



- 13. During the November 1, 2010 procedure, GLAZERMAN completely transected all the way through the small bowel of CARTER with the instruments provided by TGH, causing flesh-eating bacteria to pour into her abdomen.
- 14. During the November 1, 2010 procedure, GLAZERMAN and the TGH support staff negligently and carelessly failed to observe that the small bowel had been transected.
- 15. Without an explanation to CARTER, following the outpatient surgery, GLAZERMAN and the TGH staff decided to admit CARTER to the patient floor at TGH.

### **DAY TWO**

- 16. On November 2, 2010, at approximately 1900 hours, CARTER's mother telephoned CARTER and noticed she was out of breath. She then immediately telephoned the TGH Nurses's station for 7C to inquire why her daughter was still in the hospital for same day surgery which occurred the day before, and why she had shortness of breath. She was then told by the attending TGH nurse that all was well and morphine was given to reduce pain, even though CARTER was allergic to morphine and had informed TGH prior to surgery that she was allergic to morphine, which causes her shortness of breath.
  - 17. Pursuant to disclosed TGH records:
    - A. On November 2, 2010, at 2115 hours, CARTER was assisted to the restroom by her TGH attending nurse. As soon as she stood up to return to her bed, the umbilical incision from the prior November 1, 2010 laparoscopic procedure opened and "copious" amounts of serosanguineous drainage came pouring out, in such a large amount

- that the attending nurse had to grab a large bath towel to absorb the bloody discharge as she helped CARTER back to her bed.
- B. Fifteen minutes later, at or after 2130 hours, CARTER'S blood pressure was reported to have dropped to 67/48 and oxygen saturation was recorded at only 88%. The attending physician was paged and did not respond. The attending nurse then paged the TGH "Rapid Response Team," "RRT."
- C. At 2140 hours, only one of the two member RRT responded, i.e., a RN with a two year nursing degree. The RN for the on-call OB/GYN returned the prior doctor's page and placed the attending nurse on "hold." After waiting five minutes on hold, the TGH attending nurse hung-up and then returned to CARTER.
- D. At 2150 hours, the RN for the on-call OB/GYN then called the attending nurse back and told her to page the High Risk OB/GYN, which she did.
- E. At 2155, the High Risk OB/GYN returned the call.
- F. At 2205, a 1000ml IV bolus was started, but at 2210, it was found to be not connected and running on the floor.
- G. At 2250 the medical resident arrived and noted CARTER as incoherent, with blood pressure not recorded with an automatic cuff; but stat RN recording blood pressure manually at "50's/30's." Stat labs ordered; concern noted for intraperitoneal bleeding; and a CT

scan ordered for evaluation, but not done; transfer ordered to medical ICU, not surgical ICU.

H. At 2325, the resident considered a bedside sonogram or CT scan for possible sepsis, but neither were done.

### DAY THREE

- I. On November 3, 2010, at 0045 hours, the TGH critical care physician in the medical ICU examined available radiographs and determined CARTER was in guarded condition, acute respiratory failure, possible sepsis, acute hypotension, critically ill with organ failure and severe metabolic derangements.
- J. On November 3, 2010, at 0145 hours, a renal sonogram was reportedly done. Abdominal CT scans were ordered but then canceled.
- K. On November 3, 2010, from 0145 hours, a long and unexplained delay proceeded until 1905 hours, when an attending surgeon, Hultz, appeared and decided that abdominal surgery was emergently needed due to post-op intra-abdominal catastrophe. More delay followed.

### **DAY FOUR**

L. On November 4, 2010, two abdominal surgerles were performed to finally surgically identify and repair the transected small bowel and debride dead tissue. Organs and muscles had to be removed due to the presence of the flesh-eating bacteria, necrotizing fasciitis.

- 18. As a result of the negligent breach in the standard of care by GLAZERMAN in completely transecting the small bowel, and he and TGH staff negligently falling to realize it was transected on November, 1, 2010:
  - A. necrotizing fasclitis, i.e., flesh-eating bacteria, entered CARTER's abdominal cavity and spread throughout destroying tissue, muscles and organs;
  - B. which then resulted in destruction of her stomach, intestines, muscles and organs;
  - C. which then caused hypotension;
  - which necessitated the introduction of vasopressors to build up her blood pressure;
  - G. which then cut off circulation to her extremities;
  - H. which then ultimately caused gangrene in all four extremities;
  - which then necessitated the amputation of most of her forearms, both hands, both legs below the knee;
  - J. which also resulted in the intestines, that part not yet damaged by the flesh-eating bacteria, being removed from her abdomen and placed outside her abdomen in a skin pouch with skin taken from her legs and back.

### **COUNT I-TGH and USF**

- 19. Plaintiff re-alleges ¶¶ 1 through 18 above.
- 20. TGH and USF, through GLAZERMAN, negligently breached the standard of care by transecting CARTER'S small bowel.
- 21. TGH and USF, through GLAZERMAN, residents, TGH staff physicians, TGH nurses, TGH and/or USF high risk OB/GYN, and TGH critical care doctors negligently breached the standard of care by:
  - A. Failing to timely realize the small bowel had been transected;
  - B. Failing to timely re-enter the abdomen when CARTER presented with signs and symptoms on November 2, 2010, such as low urine output, low blood pressure, hypoxia, supplemental oxygen, drainage of what looked like bowel contents along with compromised vital organ dysfunction in a woman with a history of a difficult laparoscopic procedure the day before. This should have prompted the team providing her care to consider an intra-abdominal catastrophe, such as bowel perforation;
  - G. Failing to realize the above symptoms are most likely due to bowel perforation which will cause intra-abdominal sepsis and septic shock if left untreated for a short period of time;
  - Failing to realize that the serosanguinous drainage was a significant sign of urgency with a likely intra-abdominal complication necessitating rapid surgical evaluation;

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- Failing to promptly initiate antibiotics at the same time there was a decision to add vasopressors;
- F. Failing to take timely appropriate steps to identify the infection;
- G. Failing to properly and timely diagnose profound septic shock when
   all Indicators are present for such diagnosis;
- H. failing to timely act within a reasonable period of time to order broad spectrum antibiotics and formally assess the abdomen, either with a CT scan or, preferably, an emergency laparotomy;
- Failing to consider the use of Glucocorticoids, which if used, as they
  were indicated for this condition, would have mitigated the need for
  vasopressors and limited the gangrene and resulting calamitous result
  of loss of both hands and both feet;
- J. Hospital nursing negligence in failing to go up the chain of command when faced with obvious signs of intra-abdominal catastrophe, with untimely emergent care, when necessary testing, medication, and surgical intervention were not timely performed in violation of the Nurse Practices Act, §§ 464.001-.027, Fla. Stat. Had the nurses accessed the chain of command, such conduct would likely have affected the treatment decisions of the treating physicians and have led to a different outcome for the Plaintiff.
- 22. The above acts and conduct of said agents, employees, personnel, nurses, physicians, surgeons, hospital staff of TGH and USF, and hospital administration of TGH were at all times within the course and scope of their agency and/or employment with TGH,

within the partnership between TGH and USF, and said acts and conduct were a deviation from the usual, ordinary and customary standards of medical care and treatment acceptable under the same or similar circumstances in the same or similar community, and were thereby negligent, careless, and in violation of the duties that they owed CARTER

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- 23. As a direct result of the negligence of TGH and USF, Plaintiff, CARTER, suffered:
  - A. an additional 11 surgeries;

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- B. gangrene and then amputation of both hands and feet;
- C scarring; disfigurement;
- D. continued placement of intestines outside her body in a skin pouch;
- E. development of a fistula requiring around the clock expensive supplies and treatment by highly skilled nursing;
- F. pain, suffering, and emotional damages;
- G. the need for highly skilled medical personnel 24 hours per day, seven days a week for the rest of her life;
- H. loss of independent living and transportation;
- loss of employment opportunity; diminished earning capacity; loss of the ability to earn money; loss of benefits and retirement;
- J. hospitalization; medical expenses, therapy, past and future;
- K. the continuing need for special living accommodations, and
- other continuing expenses which will increase in cost for the duration of her lifetime.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff, LISA-MARIA CARTER, demands judgment in her favor and against the Defendants, FLORIDA HEALTH SCIENCES CENTER, INC., doing business as TAMPA GENERAL HOSPITAL and THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE UNIVERSITY OF SOUTH FLORIDA operating THE UNIVERSITY OF SOUTH FLORIDA HEALTH, doing business as the UNIVERSITY OF SOUTH FLORIDA COLLEGE OF MEDICINE, jointly and severally, for compensatory damages, together with prejudgment interest, costs, and other relief, and demands trial by jury. Plaintiff hereby gives notice that she will be requesting punitive damages pursuant to §768.72, Fla. Stat., against TGH.

### COUNT II- GLAZERMAN

- 24. Plaintiff re-alleges ¶¶ 1 through 18 above.
- 25. On November 2, and 3, 2010, during the course of his actual or apparent agency with TGH, in addition to his negligence on November 1, 2010, GLAZERMAN, acted in bad faith or in a manner exhibiting wanton and willful disregard of human rights or safety, by giving orders and writing in his operative report, knowing other TGH personnel would rely on it, that he inspected the small bowel during the November 1, 2010 surgery for perforation, when he obviously did not; and by canceling sonogram and CT scans which would have shown a transected bowel and lead to emergency repair of the bowel in a timely fashion. His conduct contributed to the delay for timely surgical intervention, in conjunction with the negligence of TGH employees and agents noted above, so that by the time surgery did take place in the early morning hours of November 4, 2010, approximately 60 hours after the first negligent surgery on November 1, 2010, it was too little too late to save the internal organs, hands, and feet of CARTER. To this day, GLAZERMAN

continues the concealment of his behavior by not correcting his operative report to state he transected the small bowel.

- 26. The above acts and conduct of GLAZERMAN were at all times within the course and scope of his agency with TGH, within the partnership between TGH and USF, and said acts and conduct were a deviation from the usual, ordinary and customary standards of medical care and treatment acceptable under the same or similar circumstances, in the same or similar community, and were far beyond grossly negligent, willful, or intentional, and in violation of the duties that he owed CARTER
- 27. As a direct result of the extremely gross negligence, bad faith, willful and intentional acts of GLAZERMAN, CARTER had a delay in needed surgery, lost opportunity to save her extremities, an additional 11 surgeries; loss of all hands and feet; scarring; disfigurement; placement of intestines outside her body, pain, suffering, and emotional damages; developed a fistula requiring expensive supplies and treatment by highly skilled nursing; the need for highly skilled medical personnel, loss of independent transportation; resulting loss of employment opportunity; diminished earning capacity; loss of the ability to earn money; loss of retirement; hospitalization; medical expenses, loss of the ability for independent living, requiring unusual and expensive care and treatment by professionals twenty-four hours per day, seven days a week; special living accommodations, and other expenses all of which will remain and continue to increase in cost for the duration of her lifetime.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff, LISA-MARIA CARTER, demands judgment in her favor and against the Defendant, LARRYR. GLAZERMAN, M.D. together with prejudgement interest,

costs, and other relief, and demands trial by jury. Plaintiff hereby gives notice that she will be requesting punitive damages pursuant to §768.72, Fla. Stat.


