Additional Information

Fellows are expected to attain a high level of expertise in the subspeciality, including clinical skills, research, and provision of excellent, comprehensive care. Training occurs at two major sites, with faculty and resources provided by the University of Arizona faculty in Tucson and by faculty from Phoenix Perinatal Associates and Banner Good Samaritan Medical Center (also appointed faculty of the University of Arizona) in Phoenix. Prenatal diagnostic skills, including genetic counseling, targeted ultrasound and fetal and Doppler echocardiography are important components of the fellowship. Critical care, multiple gestation management and invasive fetal diagnosis and therapy are emphasized at the Phoenix site. Research programs are currently in

place in both the obstetrics and gynecology departments and in departments which work closely with obstetrics and gynecology, such as neonatology, genetics/dysmorphology, pediatric and adult cardiology, and the Cancer Center. A fully-equipped large animal laboratory is available, as well as basic science laboratory space. A minimum of three months and a maximum of nine months of the fellowship can be spent in Phoenix. Additional opportunities exist for practice management and leadership development, as the fellowship combines academic and private practice Maternal-Fetal Medicine experience. The geographical location and singularity of the medical school in Arizona allow ready access to a large population of patients, including those with unique cultural and genetic backgrounds, and other citizens of the state who seek care from the medical school.
