Sarah **Traxler**, MD has been a strong advocate of women's reproductive rights and health care access for nearly two decades. After graduating from Tulane University in 1997 with a BA in Spanish and Latin America Studies, Dr. **Traxler** began her career as an AmeriCorps VISTA working with battered women and homeless youth in Texas. Working as an HIV Specialist in Austin, Dr. **Traxler** learned the value of harm reduction to assist underserved populations on the streets. In addition, she consistently volunteered with groups dedicated to women's reproductive rights including the Rosie Jimenez Fund and Planned Parenthood. Her experiences led her to a career in medicine where she could provide health care to women and provide abortion care. Dr. **Traxler** attended Oregon Health and Sciences University for medical school from 2004-2009 and did her OB/GYN residency training at the University of Minnesota from 2009-2013. She currently serves as a Family Planning Fellow at the University of Pennsylvania and throughout her residency and fellowship has maintained a commitment to underserved populations in medicine. Dr. **Traxler's** fellowship research focus involves contraception for women with complex medical conditions with a specific focus on women with cystic fibrosis.

Jen Moore Conrow, MFS, began her career in reproductive justice in public policy at NARAL: Pro-Choice America, but quickly found her calling in the world of clinical abortion and pregnancy loss care. For nearly a decade at Cherry Hill Women's Center, Jen was part of a team that defined quality late abortion care while also working actively in the local and national community to destigmatize abortion and to increase access to care for all women and families. During this time, Jen was a founding board member of the Abortion Care Network, an organization created to support and empower independent abortion providers and allied reproductive justice organizations. Currently, Jen is the Director of the Penn Family Planning and Pregnancy Loss Center, where she oversees the Ryan Family Planning Fellowship and residency training program, educating and training the next generation of abortion providers and serves on the boards of the Abortion Care Network and the CHOICE Hotline of Philadelphia.
