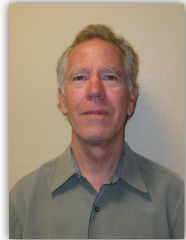
Ellen Kruusmagi, MD

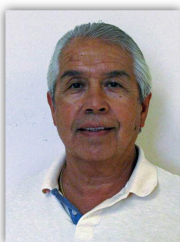
Ashley Weinert MD
