She is active in the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOG), and currently serves as ACOG District IV Junior Fellow Secretary.

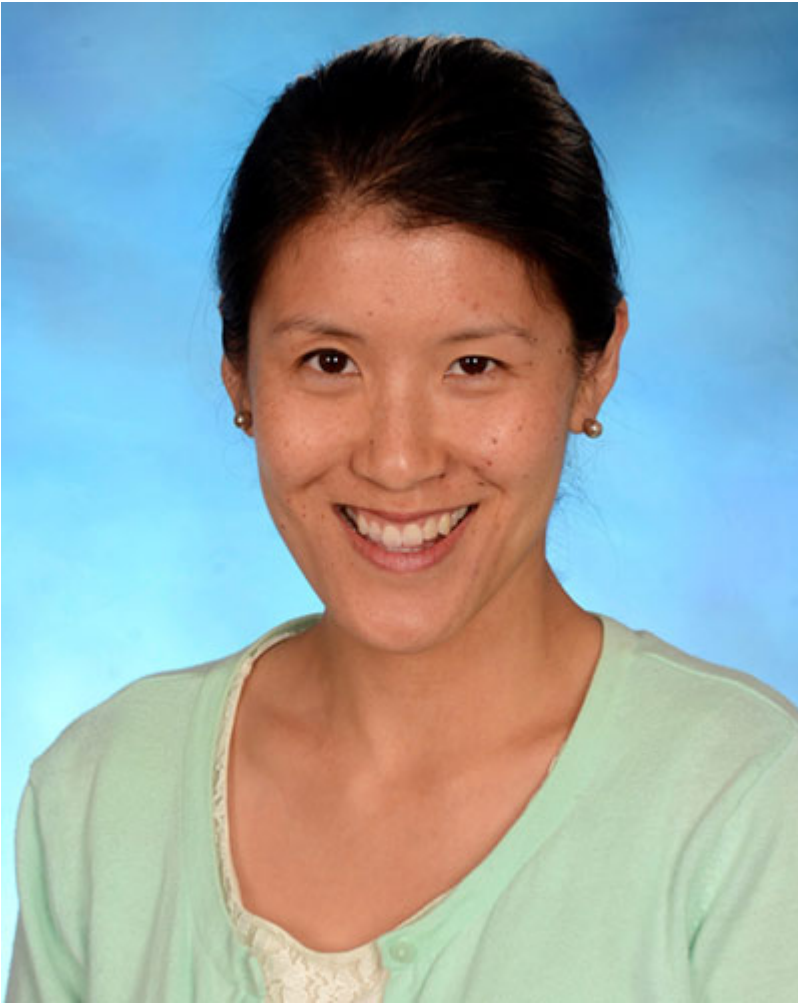
Her areas of research and clinical interest involve pain management during gynecological procedures, emergency contraception, and contraceptive counseling.
