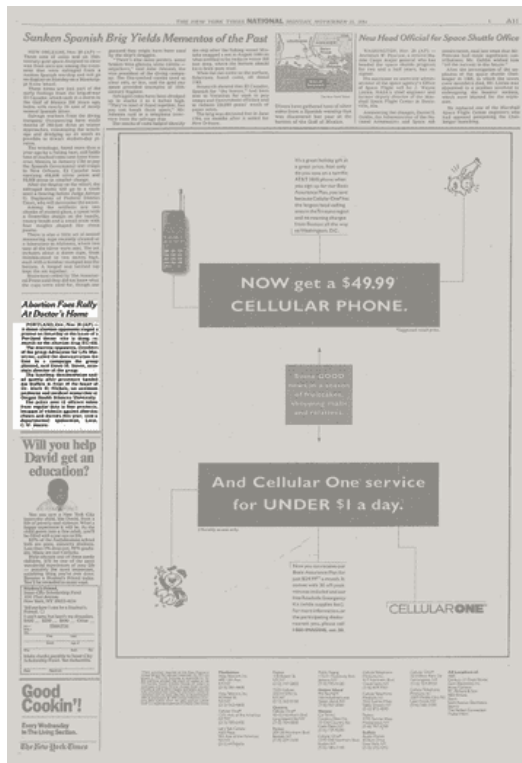


Abortion Foes Rally At Doctor's Home

A dozen abortion opponents staged a protest on Saturday at the house of a Portland doctor who is doing research on the abortion drug RU-486.

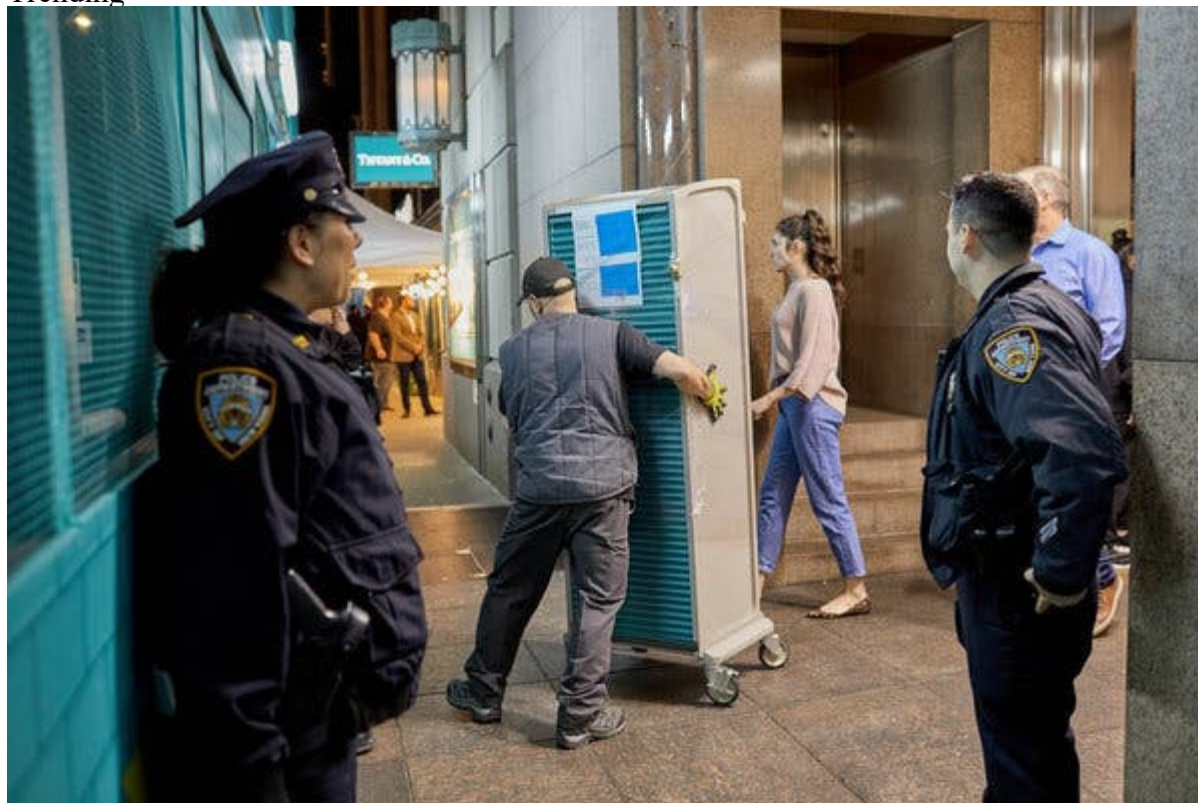
The abortion opponents, members of the group Advocates for Life Ministries, called the demonstration the first in a campaign the group planned, said Dawn M. Stover, associate director of the group.

The hourlong demonstration ended quietly after protesters handed out leaflets in front of the house of Dr. Mark D. Nichols, an assistant professor and medical researcher at Oregon Health Sciences University.

The police sent 12 officers taken from regular duty in four precincts, because of violence against abortion clinics and doctors this year, said a departmental spokesman, Lieut. C. W. Jensen.
