SMITH, Mose, III, M.D., appeared at the request of the Board concerning cases #93-28, #93-119, #93-145, and #93-158. With regard to #93-119. Dr. McGhee recommended that he have specifically 25 cases over-read. Dr. Bell agreed to do the over-read. Dr. Zini seconded. All were in favor. Dr. Clopton voiced concern that patients did not know when they go in what the minimum charge is going to be. Dr. Jouett asked Dr. Smith to follow through with Dr. Bell for the 25, he will then report back to the Board.

Cases #93-28; 93-119; 93-145; and 93-158. These cases involve the ability of the physician to accurately read the ultrasounds, with patients complaining that perhaps they were having to seek services elsewhere because of a misreading thus costing them extra money or even receiving the wrong information. Dr. John Bell had been asked to review the accuracy of the ultrasounds and the quality of the film. Dr. Bell reviewed 25 ultrasound examinations and stated the quality was appropriate for the purpose it served. For evaluation of the fetal age, the examinations were appropriate. The cursors were adequately placed and they could accurately determine the fetal age. The overall quality of the study was appropriate for that type of practice. The Board found there was no evidence of violation and the cases were closed.
