17	IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED by and between complainant's
18	successor Stephen R. Wilford, Acting Executive Director of the
19	Board of Medical Quality Assurance (hereinafter the "board"), by
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	and through his attorney of record John K. Van De Kamp, Attorney

26	1. Respondent Nicholas G. Braemer, M.D.

(hereinafter the "respondent") has received and read the

accusation heretofore filed herein in case number D-2962 currently pending before the Division of Medical Quality (hereinafter the "division") of the board. A copy of said accusation is attached hereto as Annex "A" and is incorporated herein as though fully set forth.

- 2. Respondent has retained the services of
 Artis C. Grant, Jr., to be his attorney of record in case
 number D-2962. Furthermore, respondent has consulted with
 Mr. Grant concerning the content and effect of this stipulation.
- 3. Respondent is aware of his right to a hearing on the charges and allegations contained in the accusation, his right to reconsideration, appeal, and all other rights which may be afforded him by the California Administrative Procedure Act in connection with the accusation. For the purposes of this stipulation, respondent hereby freely and voluntarily waives his right to a hearing, his right to reconsideration, to appeal, and to any and all rights afforded him by the California Administrative Act or any law with regard to the accusation.
- 4. Respondent understands the nature of the charges alleged in the accusation and understands said charges may constitute cause for disciplinary action upon his physician's and surgeon's certificate.
- 5. At the time of the executing and filing of the accusation in case number D-2962, Robert G. Rowland was the duly appointed Executive Director for the board and filed the accusation solely in his official capacity.

6. At the time of the occurrence of the acts and omissions alleged in the accusation, respondent was the holder of physician's and surgeon's certificate number A021927.

- 7. Respondent Nicholas G. Braemer, M.D., admits every factual allegation contained in paragraphs 1, 2, and 6 of the accusation, to wit:
 - A. The board has heretofore issued physician's and surgeon's license number A021927 to respondent and that at all times mentioned herein, said license was in full force and effect. In addition to the foregoing, respondent has been a Medi-Cal provider assigned provider number 00A219270 by the California State Department of Health Services; however, on March 31, 1982, said provider certificate was suspended for three years pursuant to the order of the Department of Health Services and the order of the United States Department of Health and Human Services pursuant to section 14123, subdivision (b) of the Welfare and Institutions Code.
 - B. On June 15, 1981, respondent was convicted in the United States District Court, Central District of California, of ten counts of violating 42 United States Code section 1396H(b)(1)(A) (receipt of remuneration for referring patients for treatment, the cost of which were reimbursable by Medi-Cal) in a matter entitled, "The United States of America v. Nicholas George Braemer, M.D.," case number CR 81-275. As a result of said conviction, imposition of sentence was suspended and

respondent was placed on probation for a period of two years, the terms and conditions of which included the requirement that respondent pay a fine of \$20,000.

- C. Said conviction was substantially related to the qualifications, duties and functions of a licensed physician, in that said conviction arose from his practice as a licensed physician and surgeon under the authority given him by his Medi-Cal provider certification and by his licensure by the board as a physician and surgeon.
- 8. Respondent further stipulates that, based upon said factual allegations and admissions, cause for disciplinary action against him exists based upon the provisions of sections 2220, 2227, 2234, and 2236, subdivision (a) of the Business and Professions Code.
- 9. Based upon the foregoing admissions, stipulations, and recitals, the parties hereto hereby further stipulate that the division may issue a decision and order upon the stipulation as follows:

Certificate number A-21927 issued to respondent
Nicholas G. Braemer, M.D., is revoked; however, said
revocation is stayed and respondent is placed on probation
for five years upon the following terms and conditions:

- A. As a part of probation, respondent is suspended from the practice of medicine for sixty (60) days beginning the effective date of this decision.
- B. Within sixty (60) days of the effective date of this decision, respondent shall submit to the division for

its prior approval a community service program in which respondent shall provide free medical services on a regular basis to a community or charitable facility or agency of at least eight (8) hours a week for fifty (50) weeks during each of the first two years of said probationary period.

- C. Within ninety (90) days of the effective date of this decision, and on an annual basis thereafter, respondent shall submit to the division for its prior approval an educational program or course related to general medicine, which shall not be less than forty (40) hours per year, for each year of probation. This program shall be in addition to the continuing medical educational requirements for relicensure. Following the completion of each course, the division or its designee may administer an examination to test respondent's knowledge of the course.
- D. Respondent shall obey all federal, state and local laws and all rules governing the practice of medicine in California.
- E. Respondent shall submit quarterly declarations under penalty of perjury on forms provided by the division, stating whether there has been compliance with all the conditions or probation.
- F. Respondent shall comply with the division's probation survelliance program.

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- G. Respondent shall appear in person for interviews with the division's medical consultant upon request at various intervals and with reasonable notice.
- H. In the event respondent should leave California to reside or to practice outside the state, respondent must notify in writing the division of the dates of departure and return. Period of residency or practice outside California will not apply to the reduction of this probationary period.
- I. Upon successful completion of probation, respondent's certificate will be fully restored.
- J. If respondent violates probation in any respect, the division, after giving respondent notice and the opportunity to be heard, may revoke probation and carry out the disciplinary order that was stayed. If an accusation or petition to revoke probation is filed against respondent during probation, the division shall have continuing jurisdiction until the matter is final, and the period of probation shall be extended until the matter is final.
- 10. In the event the Division of Medical Quality of the Board of Medical Quality Assurance fails to adopt this stipulation as its decision with regard to the accusation

ACCUSATION

Respondent.

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Complainant, Robert G. Rowland (hereinafter "complainant"), alleges as cause for disciplinary action that:

- 1. He is the executive director for the Board of Medical Quality Assurance (hereinafter the "board") and makes this accusation solely in his official capacity.
- The board has heretofore issued physician's and surgeon's license number A021927 to respondent Nicholas G. Braemer, M.D. (hereinafter "respondent"). At all times mentioned herein, said license was and is in full force and effect. addition to the foregoing, respondent has been a Medi-Cal provider.

assigned provider number 00A219270 by the California State

Department of Health Services; however, on March 31, 1982, said

provider certificate has been suspended for three years pursuant

to the order of the Department of Health Services and the

order of the United States Department of Health and Human

Services pursuant to section 14123, subdivision (b) of the

Welfare and Institutions Code.

- 3. Sections 2220 and 2227 of the Business and Professions Code (hereinafter all statutory references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated) provides that the Division of Medical Quality may take action against all persons guilty of violating the provisions of the Medical Practice Act (section 2000, et seq.)
- 4. Section 2234 provides that the division shall take action against any licensee who is charged with unprofessional conduct.
- 5. Section 2236, subdivision (a), provides that the conviction of any offense substantially related to the qualifications or duties of a physician or surgeon constitutes unprofessional conduct within the meaning of the Medical Practice Act.
- 6. Respondent is subject to discipline under the provisions of section 2234, taken in conjunction with section 2236, subdivision (a). The circumstances follow:
 - A. On or about June 15, 1981, respondent was convicted in the United States District Court, Central District of California, of ten counts of violating

Nicholas George Braemer, M.D.," case number CR 81-275. As a result of said conviction, imposition of sentence was suspended and respondent was placed on probation for a period of two years, the terms and conditions of which included the requirement that respondent pay a fine of \$20,000.

B. Said conviction was substantially related to the qualifications, duties and functions of a licensed physician and surgeon in that said conviction arose from his practice as a licensed physician and surgeon and under the authority given him by his Medi-Cal provider certification.

WHEREFORE, complainant prays that the division hold a hearing into the matters alleged hereinabove and, following such hearing, issue a decision:

1. Revoking or suspending physician's and surgeon's certificate number A021927 heretofore issued to respondent Nicholas G. Braemer, M.D.; and

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2. Taking such other and further action as the division deems necessary and proper under the circumstances.
