Increased Access to Abortion Services Advances in California

On April 23, the Early Access to Abortion bill (AB 154) passed out of the Assembly Health Committee on vote of 13-6. Authored by Assemblymember Toni Atkins (D-San Diego), AB 154 removes barriers to care by allowing trained health professionals to provide early abortions in the communities they serve. The legislation is based on a multi-year pilot project conducted by UCSF and involved PPSP as a key partner.



California is one of the few states in the nation moving proactive reproductive health legislation. For the past few years, state legislatures across the country and Congress have passed hundreds of bills restricting access to reproductive health care, including abortion. In 2012 alone, 43 states in the nation moved to restrict abortion access — the second highest number of restrictions on record.

25-Foot Buffer Zone Close to Reality in San Francisco

On May 7, the San Francisco Board of Supervisors passed a 25-foot "Buffer Zone" ordinance by a vote of 11-0. Sponsored by Supervisor David Campos, the "Buffer Zone" will help protect the patients and staff at PPSP and other San Francisco community health care providers from ongoing harassment, bullying and intimidation from anti-abortion protesters. Specifically the "Buffer Zone" will prevent protesters from placing signs in or continuously walking across an area 25 feet from any door, entrance or driveway of a health center that provides reproductive health services. The bill now goes to Mayor Lee for his signature.

PPSP is deeply grateful to Supervisor Campos and his staff for their amazing leadership and commitment to safe and accessible private health care services. PPSP also would like to thank our sister organizations who stood in support of the legislation including Credo, Women's Community Clinic, San Francisco Women's Political Committee, Emerge California, NARAL Pro-Choice California and the Mission Neighborhood Health Center as well as the more than 60 supportive neighbors and volunteers who attended the original committee hearing on April 19. Audacious! Courageous! Legendary!





Thanks to the extraordinary efforts of the Access for All Task Force, and the generous support of our donors, PPSP continues to make great strides toward the finish line of its expansion campaign. Created to help expand access to PPSP's services and programs across its 17 county service area, just over \$5.5 million of its \$6.5 million goal has been secured! The new Marin Regional Health and Training Center in San Rafael is in its final construction phase, and a 2014 opening of the North Bay Regional Health and Training Center in Vallejo is anticipated. Funds raised have also helped open new centers and expand education and advocacy programs.
