Research Assistant Professor, University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill Guest Researcher, Centers for Disease Control

After finishing her residency in OB/GYN at Emory University, Dr. Erin Berry-Bibee completed a fellowship in family planning and received a Master's in Public Health also at Emory University. Even though she misses being at home in the Pacific Northwest, she remained in the south for the opportunity to work as a quest researcher at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to help update and disseminate contraceptive guidelines. She has lectured and conducted trainings extensively on a diverse range of women's health topics. She has been published in peer reviewed journals such as the Journal of Lower Genital Tract Disease. Ms. Cason just completed writing a manual for incorporating sexual and reproductive services into primary care settings and is currently writing a comprehensive intrauterine contraception training course for delivery via an electronic platform and on-line use nationally. She is piloting IUC trainings with use of an electronic simulator and is actively promoting innovative patient centered contraception counseling techniques through train the trainer programs and research. She is on the leadership team for a national Sexual and Reproductive Health Work Force Project as well as the Upstream initiative for comprehensive LARC training in primary care settings.

Deputy Director, Office of Population Affairs, U.S. Department of Health and Human Services

Ms. Moskosky is responsible for management and administrative operations of the Title X Family Planning Program, as well as longrange planning; program and budget oversight; and policy development. Ms. Moskosky joined the Federal Government as a Regional Program Consultant (RPC) for Family Planning in DHHS Region VII, Kansas City, where she also served as the Region VII Women's Health Coordinator. Ms. Moskosky is a certified Women's Health Nurse Practitioner who spent the first 15 years of her professional career providing family planning, prenatal, and other preventive health services and educating nurse practitioner students for the Title X Family Planning Program. She was the Director of one of the five original Title X-funded Women's Health Care Advanced Nurse Practitioner programs at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas, Texas.



## Michael Policar, MD, MPH

Clinical Professor of Obstetrics, Gynecology, and Reproductive Sciences School of Medicine, University of California, San Francisco

Dr. Policar is a widely known speaker with particular interest in health delivery systems and women's health issues, including health screening, menopause, family planning, and female genital tract infections. He is a senior author of the textbook Contraceptive Technology (most recently, the Twentieth Revised Edition). He has served on expert advisory panels of the Centers for Disease Control and the U.S. Office of Population Affairs for developing national clinical practice guidelines for family planning management. He is a member of the Quality/Utilization Advisory Committee of the Partnership HealthPlan of California and previously served on the HealthNet California Commercial and Medicare QI/UM Committee. He is an appointed member of the California Breast and Cervical Cancer Advisory Council.



Between 1999-2005, Dr. Policar was Vice President of Medical Affairs and Chief Medical Officer of the NorthBay Healthcare System in Fairfield, California, and, in the preceding five years, served as Medical Director of the Partnership HealthPlan of California, also based in Fairfield, California. He is former Vice President for Medical Affairs of the Planned Parenthood Federation of America, Inc., a position that he held between 1992 and 1994. Between 1983 and 1992, he concurrently served as Medical Director of the Women's Health Center at the San Francisco General Hospital and as Medical Director of Planned Parenthood of Alameda/San Francisco.

## Anne Rompalo, MD

Dr. Rompalo has published over 100 peer-reviewed articles, authored/co-authored 20 book chapters and lectured for over 20 years in the fields of sexually transmitted diseases and HIV.
