Tom Tvedten, M.D., appeared before the Board at his own request. The Board had evidence, and Dr. Tvedten admitted that he had been supplying patients with Demerol injections to be injected at the discretion of the patient. After thorough discussion, motion was made by Dr. Verser and seconded by Dr. Raney that a Show Cause Order be issued to Dr. Tvedten to appear before the Board at the April Board meeting. Motion carried.

Tom Tvedten, M.D., appeared before the Board relative to a Show Cause Order which alleged that he had excessively prescribed Controlled Substances. Dr. Tvedten was represented by his attorney, Mr. Joe Wray. Witnesses for the Medical Board included: Amail Chudy, M.D., of North Little Rock, Asa Crow, M.D., of Paragould, Doyle P. Smith, M.D. of Jackson Mississippi, Warren C. Boop, Jr., M.D., of Little Rock, Dr. Gaylen Wenger of Little Rock, and Coburn S. Howell, Jr., M.D. of Little Rock. After the hearing had gone on for several hours and during a recess, the plaintiff and his attorney made a proposal to the Board's attorney. Motion was made by Dr. Verser and seconded by Mr. Currie that the Board accept the proposal as follows:

That Dr. Tvedten immediately surrender his DEA and that he continue to practice until May 22, 1983 at which time he should cease the practice of medicine and close his office until August 22, 1983 at which time he could re-open his office and again continue with the practice of medicine. Further, that Dr. Tvedten is not to apply for a DEA without meeting with the Board and getting their approval. Motion carried.

Tom Tvedten, M.D., whose license had previously been suspended for three months, and had been reinstated under the conditions that he not apply for his DEA without appearing before the Board, appeared asking for permission to reapply for his DEA. After hearing all evidence, motion was made by Dr. Verser and seconded by Dr. Raney that Dr. Tvedten be denied permission to reapply for a DEA. Motion carried.

Hyatt, the Board unanimously voted not to accept the offer of the physician and to grant a continuance of his disciplinary hearing to the December 2020 meeting. The Board further voted to lift the suspension of Dr. Tvedten's medical license and allow him to return to the practice of medicine with the stipulation that he will not certify any patients for medical marijuana.
