When considering malpractice data, please keep in mind:

- Malpractice histories tend to vary by specialty. Physicians treating certain patients and performing certain procedures are more likely to be the subject of litigation than others.
- This report reflects data for the last 10 years of a doctor's practice. For doctors practicing less than 10 years, the data covers their total years of practice. Patients should take into account how long the doctor has been in practice when considering malpractice information.
- The incident causing the malpractice claim may have happened years before a payment is finally made. Sometimes, it takes a long time for a malpractice lawsuit to move through the legal system.
- Some doctors work with high-risk patients. These doctors may have malpractice histories that are higher than average because they specialize in cases or patients who are at a very high risk of problems. Doctors who treat these high risk patients may include doctors with excellent skills and experience. Patients should evaluate physicians' level of skill, education and experience as well as their malpractice histories.
- Settlement of a claim may occur for reasons other than liability which do not necessarily reflect negatively on the professional conduct or competence of the physician. A payment or settlement of a medical malpractice action or claim does not necessarily mean that medical malpractice has occurred.
