My general research interests include abortion access, impacts of abortion restrictions, self-managed abortion, and effective messaging/story-telling. I am particularly passionate about conducting research in the U.S. Southeast, which is my home. Currently, I am conducting a qualitative study of barriers that people with high-risk pregnancies face while attempting to access an abortion in Georgia, and how additional restrictions may impact this population's access to care and health outcomes. Future directions for research include exploring a harm reduction approach to self-managed abortion and clinician training around self-managed abortion in the U.S. Southeast.
